SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure.

[Directs Housing and Community Services Department to study issues relating to housing and report to appropriate committee or interim committee of Legislative Assembly on or before September 15, 2022.]

[Sunsets December 31, 2022.]

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Housing and Community Services Depart-ment Revolving Account for low-barrier emergency shelters and to Oregon Department of Administrative Services for navigation centers. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there are appro-
5	priated to the Housing and Community Services Department, for deposit into the Housing
6	and Community Services Department Revolving Account under ORS 456.574, for the
7	biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the following amounts:
8	(1) \$27,000,000 for grants under section 9, chapter, Oregon Laws 2021 (Enrolled House
9	Bill 2006); and
10	(2) \$2,000,000 for technical assistance under section 9, chapter, Oregon Laws 2021
11	(Enrolled House Bill 2006).
12	SECTION 2. In addition to and not in lieu of any other appropriation, there are appro-
13	priated to the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, for the biennium beginning
14	July 1, 2021, out of the General Fund, the following amounts:
15	(1) \$1,500,000 to the City of McMinnville for a navigation center, pursuant to section 10,
16	chapter, Oregon Laws 2021 (Enrolled House Bill 2006);
17	(2) \$1,500,000 to the City of Roseburg for a navigation center pursuant to section 10,
18	chapter, Oregon Laws 2021 (Enrolled House Bill 2006);
19	(3) \$2,500,000 to the City of Bend for a navigation center pursuant to section 10, chapter
20	, Oregon Laws 2021 (Enrolled House Bill 2006);
21	(4) \$2,500,000 to the City of Medford for a navigation center pursuant to section 10,
22	chapter, Oregon Laws 2021 (Enrolled House Bill 2006);
23	(5) \$5,000,000 to the City of Salem for a navigation center pursuant to section 10, chapter
24	, Oregon Laws 2021 (Enrolled House Bill 2006); and

3 <u>SECTION 3.</u> Sections 1 and 2 of this 2021 Act become operative on the date that chapter
4 ____, Oregon Laws 2021 (Enrolled House Bill 2006), becomes law.

5 <u>SECTION 4.</u> This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 6 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect 7 on its passage.

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
