House Bill 2017

Sponsored by Representative OWENS (at the request of Tera Bales) (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Designates September of each year as Brain Aneurysm Awareness Month.

1	A BILL FOR AN ACT
2	Relating to Brain Aneurysm Awareness Month.
3	Whereas an unruptured brain aneurysm can lead to double vision, vision loss, loss of sensation,
4	weakness, loss of balance, incoordination and speech problems; and
5	Whereas 1 in 50 people in the United States has an unruptured brain aneurysm; and
6	Whereas a brain aneurysm is often discovered when it ruptures and causes a subarachnoid
7	hemorrhage; and
8	Whereas a subarachnoid hemorrhage can lead to brain damage, hydrocephalus, stroke and death;
9	and
10	Whereas each year, more than 30,000 people in the United States suffer from ruptured brain
11	aneurysms, and approximately half of these people die as a result; and
12	Whereas annually, between 3,000 and 4,500 people in the United States with ruptured brain
13	aneurysms die before reaching the hospital; and
14	Whereas a number of advancements have been made in recent years that improve the detection
15	of aneurysms, including computerized tomography scans, magnetic resonance imaging and cerebral
16	arteriograms; and
17	Whereas early detection can save lives; and
18	Whereas various research studies are currently being conducted in the United States in order
19	to better understand, prevent and treat brain aneurysms; and
20	Whereas organizations such as the Brain Aneurysm Foundation serve as global leaders for brain
21	aneurysm education, support, advocacy and research funding; and
22	Whereas the devastating effects of brain aneurysms on Oregonians can be minimized through
23	increased public awareness about prevention, detection and treatment; now, therefore,
24	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
25	SECTION 1. September of each year is designated as Brain Aneurysm Awareness Month.

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
