

House Bill 2055

Introduced and printed pursuant to House Rule 12.00. Pre-session filed (at the request of Governor Kate Brown for Department of Education)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Establishes Tribal Early Learning Hub for purpose of delivering early learning services to tribal communities of this state.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the Tribal Early Learning Hub.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:**

5 (a) **"Tribal advisory committee" means the committee established by the Early Learning**
6 **Division for the purpose of advising the Early Learning Council on the Tribal Early Learning**
7 **Hub.**

8 (b) **"Tribal Early Learning Hub" means the entity designated by the Early Learning**
9 **Council, in consultation with the tribal advisory committee, to coordinate early learning**
10 **services provided to the tribal communities of this state, as determined by rules adopted by**
11 **the Early Learning Council in consultation with the tribal advisory committee.**

12 (2) **The Early Learning Council shall implement and coordinate a system that coordinates**
13 **the delivery of early learning services to the tribal communities of this state through the**
14 **direction of the Tribal Early Learning Hub. The Tribal Early Learning Hub shall be separate**
15 **and distinct from the Early Learning Hubs designated under ORS 417.827.**

16 (3) **The Early Learning Division shall establish a tribal advisory committee. The tribal**
17 **advisory committee shall consist of 25 members appointed by the Early Learning Division**
18 **as follows:**

19 (a) **Two representatives from each of the nine federally recognized Indian tribes of this**
20 **state;**

21 (b) **One representative from the Commission on Indian Services;**

22 (c) **Four parents of children enrolled in early childhood care and early childhood educa-**
23 **tion programs, as identified by representatives of the nine federally recognized Indian tribes**
24 **of this state;**

25 (d) **One representative of the Early Learning Council, who shall be a nonvoting member;**
26 **and**

27 (e) **One representative of the Early Learning Division, who shall be a nonvoting member.**

28 (4) **The tribal advisory committee shall advise the Early Learning Council on the delivery**
29 **of early care and education services to the tribal communities of this state in a culturally**
30 **specific manner. The Early Learning Council shall adopt rules related to the Tribal Early**
31 **Learning Hub in consultation with the tribal advisory committee, including rules that pre-**

1 **scribe the requirements for accountability and services provided.**

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
