## House Bill 2526

Sponsored by Representative SANCHEZ; Representatives REARDON, SOLLMAN (Presession filed.)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Designates second Monday of October of each year as Indigenous Peoples' Day. Declares emergency, effective on passage.

2	Relating to Indigenous Peoples' Day; and declaring an emergency.
3	Whereas Christopher Columbus, a man who is known to have "discovered" the Americas, came
4	upon land that was already inhabited by Indigenous People, his historically cited contributions being
5	either inaccurate or facially not worthy of celebrating; and
6	Whereas Columbus' voyage to the Americas opened the door to heinous crimes against human
7	ity, including but not limited to the introduction of transatlantic slavery and genocidal acts agains
8	Indigenous People; and
9	Whereas the Indigenous People were promised security and protection but instead were forcibly
10	relocated and their land seized to allow for settlements; and
11	Whereas the State of Oregon recognizes and acknowledges the significant contributions made
12	in our community by Indigenous People and commits to ensure greater access and opportunity for
13	continued contribution; and
14	Whereas the State of Oregon has the opportunity and means to cultivate a community tha
15	honors and respects the diverse history of this land; and
16	Whereas the State of Oregon does not formally recognize Columbus Day; and
17	Whereas it is appropriate to recognize the original inhabitants of the Americas: Indigenous
18	People; and
19	Whereas the idea of Indigenous Peoples' Day was first proposed in 1977 by a delegation of Na
20	tive Nations to the United Nations; and
21	Whereas the State of Oregon, upon adoption of this Act, would become the 11th state in the
22	United States to formally recognize Indigenous Peoples' Day; now, therefore,
23	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
24	SECTION 1. The second Monday in October of each year is designated as Indigenous
25	Peoples' Day.
26	SECTION 2. This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public
27	peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect
28	on passage.
