House Bill 2746

Sponsored by Representative NOBLE (at the request of Diana Gutman) (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Directs State Court Administer to develop and implement Hope Card Program for issuance of information cards to persons who are protected by restraining orders.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2	Relating to protective order information cards.
3	Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
4	SECTION 1. (1) The State Court Administrator shall develop and implement the Hope
5	Card Program. The Hope Card Program shall provide an information card to each person
6	who is issued a restraining order under ORS 30.866, 107.700 to 107.735, 124.005 to 124.040
7	163.730 to 163.750 or 163.760 to 163.777.
8	(2) The information card issued under this section must:
9	(a) Be a durable, wallet-sized card containing essential information about the restraining
10	order, including the identifying information and characteristics of the person subject to the
11	restraining order, the case number, the issuance and expiration date of the restraining or
12	der, the terms of the restraining order and the names of any other persons protected by the
13	restraining order.
14	(b) Include a statement in substantially the following form:

17	If you see the person who you are protected from within your radius, immediately call 911
18	You cannot violate your own restraining order. Do not expect help from strangers. Present
19	your case number from the other side of this card to the 911 dispatcher and the responding
20	police officer.

23	(3) The Chief Justice of the Supreme Court may adopt rules to carry out the purposes
24	of this section.
25	SECTION 2. The Hope Card Program shall provide the information cards described in
26	section 1 of this 2021 Act to persons who are issued restraining orders on or after the ef
27	fective date of this 2021 Act.
