## House Bill 3009

Sponsored by Representative NOSSE

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Authorizes radiologist to serve on Health Evidence Review Commission. Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to the Health Evidence Review Commission; amending ORS 414.688; and prescribing an ef fective date.

4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 414.688 is amended to read:

6 414.688. (1) As used in this section:

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7 (a) "Practice of pharmacy" has the meaning given that term in ORS 689.005.

8 (b) "Retail drug outlet" has the meaning given that term in ORS 689.005.

9 (2) The Health Evidence Review Commission is established in the Oregon Health Authority,

10 consisting of 13 members appointed by the Governor in consultation with professional and other 11 interested organizations, and confirmed by the Senate, as follows:

(a) Five members must be physicians licensed to practice medicine in this state who have clinical expertise in the areas of family medicine, internal medicine, obstetrics, perinatal health,
pediatrics, disabilities, geriatrics, radiology or general surgery. One of the physicians must be a
doctor of osteopathic medicine, and one must be a hospital representative or a physician whose
practice is significantly hospital-based.

17 (b) One member must be a dentist licensed under ORS chapter 679 who has clinical expertise 18 in general, pediatric or public health dentistry.

19 (c) One member must be a public health nurse.

20 (d) One member must be a behavioral health representative who may be a social services 21 worker, alcohol and drug treatment provider, psychologist or psychiatrist.

(e) Two members must be consumers of health care who are patient advocates or represent the
 areas of indigent services, labor, business, education or corrections.

(f) One member must be a complementary or alternative medicine provider who is a chiropractic
 physician licensed under ORS chapter 684, a naturopathic physician licensed under ORS chapter 685
 or an acupuncturist licensed under ORS chapter 677.

(g) One member must be an insurance industry representative who may be a medical directoror other administrator.

(h) One member must be a pharmacy representative who engages in the practice of pharmacyat a retail drug outlet.

31 (3) No more than six members of the commission may be physicians either in active practice or

1 retired from practice.

2 (4) Members of the commission serve for a term of four years at the pleasure of the Governor.

3 A member is eligible for reappointment.

(5) Members are not entitled to compensation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary
travel and other expenses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the manner
and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses shall be paid out of funds available
to the Oregon Health Authority for purposes of the commission.

8 <u>SECTION 2.</u> This 2021 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2021 9 regular session of the Eighty-first Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.

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
