## House Bill 3026

Sponsored by Representatives HUDSON, MORGAN; Representative LIVELY, Senator GELSER

## SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Department of Transportation to waive fee for issuing, renewing or replacing identification card if person who is issued card is experiencing homelessness. Becomes operative January 1, 2022.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

## A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to identification card fees; creating new provisions; amending ORS 807.410; and declaring

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4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

5 **SECTION 1.** ORS 807.410 is amended to read:

6 807.410. (1) The following fees apply to identification cards unless otherwise provided by ORS

- 7 807.400 or otherwise provided by law:
- 8 (a) For issuance of an original identification card, \$44.50.

9 (b) For renewal of an identification card, \$40.50.

- 10 (c) For replacement of an identification card, \$39.50.
- 11 (d) For reinstatement of an identification card after suspension, \$75.
- 12 (e) For issuance of an original limited term identification card, \$20.

13 (f) For renewal of a limited term identification card, \$18.

- 14 (g) For replacement of a limited term identification card, \$39.50.
- (2) The Department of Transportation may not charge a fee for issuing, renewing or replacinga parking identification card.

17 (3) The department may not charge a fee for issuing or renewing an identification card, 18 or providing two replacement identification cards before the expiration of the current identification card, for an individual who is experiencing homelessness. The individual shall 19 20 present a form that indicates the individual qualifies for the fee waiver, as determined by a 21nonprofit organization that provides services to individuals experiencing homelessness. Be-22fore a nonprofit organization issues documentation under this subsection, the organization 23 must first meet the standards established by the department by rule. The department, by 24 rule, shall prescribe the form.

(2) The Department of Transportation may take any action before the operative date
specified in subsection (1) of this section that is necessary to enable the department to exercise, on and after the operative date specified in subsection (1) of this section, all of the
duties, functions and powers conferred on the department by the amendments to ORS 807.410

2 <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public

peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect
on its passage.

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
