SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure

Appropriates moneys from General Fund to Department of State Police for certain biennial expenses.

Limits certain biennial expenditures from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscella-neous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by department. Limits biennial expenditures by department from federal funds for certain purposes. Limits biennial expenditures by department from certain moneys or other revenues allocated to Parks and Natural Resources Fund for certain purposes. **Modifies certain biennial appropriation made from General Fund to department.**

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2021.

28	the Department of State Police for fish and wildlife enforcement activities.		
29	SECTION 5. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation		
30	made to the Department of State Police by section 1 (1), chapter 568, Oregon Laws 2019, for		
31	the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for patrol services, criminal investigations, gaming		
32	enforcement and the office of the State Fire Marshal, is increased by \$268,200 for the state's		
33	share of federally reimbursable wildfire expenses incurred during the 2020 wildfires.		
34	SECTION 6. This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public		
35	peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect		
36	July 1,	2021.	
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
