Services and Oregon Health Authority for biennium ending June 30, 2021.

Modifies certain limitations on expenditures for department and authority for biennium ending June 30, 2021.

Declares emergency, effective [July 1, 2021] on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to state financial administration; and declaring an emergency. 2

3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation

5 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (1), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, 6 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for central services and state assessments and

7 enterprise-wide costs, is increased by \$9,861,413.

8 SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation

9 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (2), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, 10 for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for self-sufficiency and vocational rehabilitation ser-

vices, is decreased by \$5,190,224. 11

12SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation

13 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (3), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019,

for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for child welfare, is decreased by \$36,477,331. 14

15 SECTION 4. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation 16 made to the Department of Human Services by section 1 (4), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, for aging and people with disabilities and 17 intellectual/developmental disabilities programs, is increased by \$10,814,946. 18

19 SECTION 5. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (2), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium 20ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or 2122other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal 23funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries

Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (5), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium 13 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or 14 15 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts and Medicare receipts and including federal 16 funds for indirect cost recovery, Social Security Supplemental Security Income recoveries and the Child Care and Development Fund, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not 17 18 described in this section, collected or received by the Department of Human Services, for 19 shared services, is increased by \$1,451,699 to allow the department to purchase document 20scanners.

<u>SECTION 8.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 3 (1), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds, excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the Department of Human Services, for central services and state assessments and enterprise-wide costs, is increased by \$2,041,080.

27 <u>SECTION 9.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on 28 expenditures established by section 3 (2), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium 29 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds, 30 excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or 31 received by the Department of Human Services, for self-sufficiency and vocational rehabili-32 tation, is decreased by \$15,137,677.

<u>SECTION 10.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 3 (3), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds, excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the Department of Human Services, for child welfare, is decreased by \$22,973,174.

<u>SECTION 11.</u> Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 3 (4), chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds, excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 668, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the Department of Human Services, for aging and people with disabilities and intellectual/developmental disabilities programs, is increased by \$21,300,076.

44 <u>SECTION 12.</u> Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation 45 made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (1), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the

biennium ending June 30, 2021, for Health Systems, Health Policy and Analytics, and Public 1 2

Health, is decreased by \$185,481,431.

SECTION 13. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation 3 made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (2), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the 4 biennium ending June 30, 2021, for the Oregon State Hospital, is increased by \$10,157,168. $\mathbf{5}$

SECTION 14. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation 6 made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 1 (5), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the 7 biennium ending June 30, 2021, for debt service, is decreased by \$1,934,265. 8

9 SECTION 15. Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the General Fund appropriation made to the Oregon Health Authority by section 7, chapter 560, Oregon Laws 2019, for the 10 biennium ending June 30, 2021, is decreased by \$190,000. 11

12SECTION 16. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 2 (1), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium 13 ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or 14 15 other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, tobacco tax receipts, recreational 16marijuana tax receipts, provider taxes, Medicare receipts and federal funds for indirect cost recovery, Supplemental Security Income recoveries, Women, Infants and Children Program 17 18 food rebates, the Coordinated School Health Program, the Edward Byrne Memorial State and 19 Local Law Enforcement Assistance Grant Program and emergency preparedness and re-20sponse services, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds not described in section 2, chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or received by the Oregon Health Authority, for 2122Health Systems, Health Policy and Analytics, and Public Health, is decreased by \$5,807,409.

Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the limitation on expenditures established by section 4 (1), chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, for the biennium 2425ending June 30, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses from federal funds, excluding federal funds described in section 2, chapter 695, Oregon Laws 2019, collected or 2627received by the Oregon Health Authority, for Health Systems, Health Policy and Analytics, and Public Health, is increased by \$167,321,358. 28

SECTION 18. This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public 2930 peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect 31 on its passage.

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
