## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Makes employment of minors at business that permits live entertainment exhibiting obscene performance unlawful employment practice.

Allows unlawfully employed person to file complaint with Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries.

## Relating to employment of minors at businesses that permit live entertainment that exhibits an ob-2 scene performance. 3 4 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: SECTION 1. Section 2 of this 2021 Act is added to and made a part of ORS 653.305 to 5 653.370. 6 SECTION 2. (1) An individual under 18 years of age may not be employed in any place 7 8 of business that permits live entertainment that in whole or in part exhibits an obscene 9 performance. (2) A violation of this section is an unlawful employment practice under ORS chapter 10 659A. A person unlawfully employed under this section may file a complaint under ORS 11 659A.820 with the Commissioner of the Bureau of Labor and Industries. 12 (3) For purposes of this section: 13

(a) "Live entertainment" has the meaning given that term in ORS 651.200.

(b) "Obscene performance" has the meaning given that term in ORS 167.060.
