

## SENATE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 201

By COMMITTEE ON JUDICIARY AND BALLOT MEASURE 110 IMPLEMENTATION

- 1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, delete “creating new provisions;”.
- 2 In line 3, delete “163.149.”.
- 3 Delete lines 5 through 29 and delete pages 2 through 5 and insert:
- 4 “**SECTION 1.** ORS 813.010 is amended to read:
- 5 “813.010. (1) A person commits the offense of driving while under the influence of intoxicants if
- 6 the person drives a vehicle while the person:
- 7 “(a) Has 0.08 percent or more by weight of alcohol in the blood of the person as shown by
- 8 chemical analysis of the breath or blood of the person made under ORS 813.100, 813.140 or 813.150;
- 9 “(b) Is under the influence of intoxicating liquor, cannabis, a controlled substance or an
- 10 inhalant; [or]
- 11 “(c) Is under the influence of any combination of intoxicating liquor, cannabis, a controlled
- 12 substance and an inhalant[.]; or
- 13 “**(d) Within two hours after driving a vehicle, and without consuming alcohol in the in-**
- 14 **tervening time period, has 0.08 percent or more by weight of alcohol in the blood of the**
- 15 **person, as shown by chemical analysis of the breath or blood of the person made under ORS**
- 16 **813.100, 813.140 or 813.150.**
- 17 “(2) A person may not be convicted of driving while under the influence of intoxicants on the
- 18 basis of being under the influence of a controlled substance or an inhalant unless the fact that the
- 19 person was under the influence of a controlled substance or an inhalant is pleaded in the accusatory
- 20 instrument and is either proved at trial or is admitted by the person through a guilty plea.
- 21 “(3) A person convicted of the offense described in this section is subject to ORS 813.020 in
- 22 addition to this section.
- 23 “(4) Except as provided in subsection (5) of this section, the offense described in this section,
- 24 driving while under the influence of intoxicants, is a Class A misdemeanor and is applicable upon
- 25 any premises open to the public.
- 26 “(5)(a) Driving while under the influence of intoxicants is a Class C felony if the current offense
- 27 was committed in a motor vehicle and the person has, at least three times in the 10 years prior to
- 28 the date of the current offense, been convicted of, or been found to be within the jurisdiction of the
- 29 juvenile court for an act that if committed by an adult would be, any of the following offenses in
- 30 any combination:
- 31 “(A) Driving while under the influence of intoxicants in violation of **this section**[:].
- 32 “[(i) *This section*; or]
- 33 “[(ii)] **(B)** The statutory counterpart to this section in another jurisdiction.
- 34 “[(B)] **(C)** A driving under the influence of intoxicants offense in another jurisdiction that in-
- 35 volved the impaired driving or operation of a vehicle, an aircraft or a boat due to the use of

1 intoxicating liquor, cannabis, a controlled substance, an inhalant or any combination thereof.

2 “[(C)] (D) A driving offense in another jurisdiction that involved operating a vehicle, an aircraft  
3 or a boat while having a blood alcohol content above that jurisdiction’s permissible blood alcohol  
4 content.

5 “(b) For the purposes of paragraph (a) of this subsection, a conviction or adjudication for a  
6 driving offense in another jurisdiction based solely on a person under 21 years of age having a blood  
7 alcohol content that is lower than the permissible blood alcohol content in that jurisdiction for a  
8 person 21 years of age or older does not constitute a prior conviction or adjudication.

9 “(6) In addition to any other sentence that may be imposed, the court shall impose one or more  
10 of the following fines on a person convicted of driving while under the influence of intoxicants as  
11 follows:

12 “(a) For a person’s first conviction, a minimum of \$1,000.

13 “(b) For a person’s second conviction, a minimum of \$1,500.

14 “(c) For a person’s third or subsequent conviction, a minimum of \$2,000 if the person is not  
15 sentenced to a term of imprisonment.

16 “(d)(A) For a person who drives a vehicle while the person has 0.15 percent or more by weight  
17 of alcohol in the blood of the person as shown by chemical analysis of the breath or blood of the  
18 person made under ORS 813.100, 813.140 or 813.150, a minimum of \$2,000.

19 “(B) For a person who, within two hours after driving a vehicle, and without consuming  
20 alcohol in the intervening time period, has 0.15 percent or more by weight of alcohol in the  
21 blood of the person, as shown by chemical analysis of the breath or blood of the person made  
22 under ORS 813.100, 813.140 or 813.150, a minimum of \$2,000.

23 “(7) Notwithstanding ORS 161.635, \$10,000 is the maximum fine that a court may impose on a  
24 person convicted of driving while under the influence of intoxicants if:

25 “(a) The current offense was committed in a motor vehicle; and

26 “(b) There was a passenger in the motor vehicle who was under 18 years of age and was at least  
27 three years younger than the person driving the motor vehicle.

28 “**SECTION 2.** ORS 813.011 is amended to read:

29 “813.011. (1) Driving under the influence of intoxicants under ORS 813.010 shall be a Class C  
30 felony if **at least two times in the 10 years prior to the date of the current offense** the de-  
31 fendant has been convicted of [*driving under the influence of intoxicants in violation of ORS 813.010,*  
32 *or its statutory counterpart in another jurisdiction, at least two times in the 10 years prior to the date*  
33 *of the current offense.*] **any of the following offenses in any combination:**

34 “(a) **Driving under the influence of intoxicants in violation of ORS 813.010, or its statu-**  
35 **tory counterpart in another jurisdiction.**

36 “(b) **A driving under the influence of intoxicants offense in another jurisdiction that in-**  
37 **volved the impaired driving or operation of a vehicle, an aircraft or a boat due to the use**  
38 **of intoxicating liquor, cannabis, a controlled substance, an inhalant or any combination**  
39 **thereof.**

40 “(c) **An offense in another jurisdiction that involved driving or operating a vehicle, an**  
41 **aircraft or a boat while having a blood alcohol content above that jurisdiction’s permissible**  
42 **blood alcohol content.**

43 “(2) Once a person has been sentenced for a Class C felony under this section, the 10-year time  
44 limitation is eliminated and any subsequent episode of driving under the influence of intoxicants  
45 shall be a Class C felony regardless of the amount of time which intervenes.

1 “(3) Upon conviction for a Class C felony under this section, the person shall be sentenced to  
2 a mandatory minimum term of incarceration of 90 days, without reduction for any reason.

3 “**SECTION 3.** ORS 813.300 is amended to read:

4 “813.300. (1) At the trial of any civil or criminal action, suit or proceeding arising out of the  
5 acts committed by a person driving a motor vehicle while under the influence of intoxicants, if the  
6 amount of alcohol in the person’s blood at the time alleged is less than 0.08 percent by weight of  
7 alcohol as shown by chemical analysis of the person’s breath or blood, it is indirect evidence that  
8 may be used with other evidence, if any, to determine whether or not the person was then under the  
9 influence of intoxicants.

10 “(2) Not less than 0.08 percent by weight of alcohol in a person’s blood constitutes being under  
11 the influence of intoxicating liquor.

12 “(3) Notwithstanding subsection (2) of this section, for purposes of the Motorist Implied Consent  
13 Law as defined in ORS 801.010, for a person who is under 21 years of age, any amount of alcohol  
14 in the blood constitutes being under the influence of intoxicating liquor.

15 “(4) Percent by weight of alcohol in the blood shall be based upon grams of alcohol per 100  
16 milliliters of blood or based upon grams of alcohol per 210 liters of breath.

17 “(5) **ORS 813.010 (1)(d) may not be construed to limit the admissibility of any evidence  
18 of the amount of alcohol in a person’s blood as shown by chemical analysis of the person’s  
19 breath or blood, in any civil or criminal action, suit or proceeding arising out of the acts  
20 committed by the person driving a vehicle while under the influence of intoxicants.**

21 “**SECTION 4.** ORS 163.118 is amended to read:

22 “163.118. (1) Criminal homicide constitutes manslaughter in the first degree when:

23 “(a) It is committed recklessly under circumstances manifesting extreme indifference to the  
24 value of human life;

25 “(b) It is committed intentionally by a defendant under the influence of extreme emotional dis-  
26 turbance as provided in ORS 163.135, which constitutes a mitigating circumstance reducing the  
27 homicide that would otherwise be murder to manslaughter in the first degree and need not be proved  
28 in any prosecution;

29 “(c) A person recklessly causes the death of a child under 14 years of age or a dependent person,  
30 as defined in ORS 163.205, and:

31 “(A) The person has previously engaged in a pattern or practice of assault or torture of the  
32 victim or another child under 14 years of age or a dependent person; or

33 “(B) The person causes the death by neglect or maltreatment, as defined in ORS 163.115; or

34 “(d) It is committed recklessly or with criminal negligence by a person operating a motor vehicle  
35 while under the influence of intoxicants in violation of ORS 813.010 and:

36 “(A) [*The person has at least three previous convictions for driving while under the influence of*  
37 *intoxicants under ORS 813.010, or its statutory counterpart in any jurisdiction, in the 10 years prior*  
38 *to the date of the current offense; or]* **In the 10 years prior to the date of the current offense the**  
39 **person has been convicted of at least three of any of the following offenses in any combina-**  
40 **tion:**

41 “(i) **Driving under the influence of intoxicants in violation of ORS 813.010, or its statutory**  
42 **counterpart in another jurisdiction;**

43 “(ii) **A driving under the influence of intoxicants offense in another jurisdiction that in-**  
44 **volved the impaired driving or operation of a vehicle, an aircraft or a boat due to the use**  
45 **of intoxicating liquor, cannabis, a controlled substance, an inhalant or any combination**

1 **thereof; or**

2 **“(iii) An offense in another jurisdiction that involved driving or operating a vehicle, an**  
3 **aircraft or a boat while having a blood alcohol content above that jurisdiction’s permissible**  
4 **blood alcohol content; or**

5 “(B)(i) The person has a previous conviction for any of the crimes described in subsection (2)  
6 of this section, or their statutory counterparts in any jurisdiction; and

7 “(ii) The victim’s serious physical injury in the previous conviction was caused by the person  
8 driving a motor vehicle.

9 “(2) The previous convictions to which subsection (1)(d)(B) of this section applies are:

10 “(a) Assault in the first degree under ORS 163.185;

11 “(b) Assault in the second degree under ORS 163.175; or

12 “(c) Assault in the third degree under ORS 163.165.

13 “(3) Manslaughter in the first degree is a Class A felony.

14 “(4) It is an affirmative defense to a charge of violating:

15 “(a) Subsection (1)(c)(B) of this section that the victim was a dependent person who was at least  
16 18 years of age and was under care or treatment solely by spiritual means pursuant to the religious  
17 beliefs or practices of the dependent person or the guardian of the dependent person.

18 “(b) Subsection (1)(d)(B) of this section that the defendant was not under the influence of  
19 intoxicants at the time of the conduct that resulted in the previous conviction.

20 **“SECTION 5.** ORS 163.185 is amended to read:

21 “163.185. (1) A person commits the crime of assault in the first degree if the person:

22 “(a) Intentionally causes serious physical injury to another by means of a deadly or dangerous  
23 weapon;

24 “(b) Intentionally or knowingly causes serious physical injury to a child under six years of age;

25 “(c) Violates ORS 163.175 knowing that the victim is pregnant; or

26 “(d) Intentionally, knowingly or recklessly causes serious physical injury to another while op-  
27 erating a motor vehicle under the influence of intoxicants in violation of ORS 813.010 and:

28 “(A) [*The person has at least three previous convictions for driving while under the influence of*  
29 *intoxicants under ORS 813.010, or its statutory counterpart in any jurisdiction, in the 10 years prior*  
30 *to the date of the current offense; or]* **In the 10 years prior to the date of the current offense the**  
31 **person has been convicted of at least three of any of the following offenses in any combina-**  
32 **tion:**

33 **“(i) Driving under the influence of intoxicants in violation of ORS 813.010, or its statutory**  
34 **counterpart in another jurisdiction;**

35 **“(ii) A driving under the influence of intoxicants offense in another jurisdiction that in-**  
36 **volved the impaired driving or operation of a vehicle, an aircraft or a boat due to the use**  
37 **of intoxicating liquor, cannabis, a controlled substance, an inhalant or any combination**  
38 **thereof; or**

39 **“(iii) An offense in another jurisdiction that involved driving or operating a vehicle, an**  
40 **aircraft or a boat while having a blood alcohol content above that jurisdiction’s permissible**  
41 **blood alcohol content; or**

42 “(B)(i) The person has a previous conviction for any of the crimes described in subsection (2)  
43 of this section, or their statutory counterparts in any jurisdiction; and

44 “(ii) The victim’s death or serious physical injury in the previous conviction was caused by the  
45 person driving a motor vehicle.

1 “(2) The previous convictions to which subsection (1)(d)(B) of this section apply are:  
2 “(a) Manslaughter in the first degree under ORS 163.118;  
3 “(b) Manslaughter in the second degree under ORS 163.125;  
4 “(c) Criminally negligent homicide under ORS 163.145;  
5 “(d) Assault in the first degree under this section;  
6 “(e) Assault in the second degree under ORS 163.175; or  
7 “(f) Assault in the third degree under ORS 163.165.  
8 “(3) Assault in the first degree is a Class A felony.  
9 “(4) It is an affirmative defense to a prosecution under subsection (1)(d)(B) of this section that  
10 the defendant was not under the influence of intoxicants at the time of the conduct that resulted in  
11 the previous conviction.

12 “**SECTION 6. This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**  
13 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect**  
14 **on its passage.”.**

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
