Senate Bill 356

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Creates position of School Nurse Specialist in Department of Education. Requires School Nurse Specialist to be registered nurse. Specifies responsibilities of School Nurse Specialist.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

2 Relating to the School Nurse Specialist.

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3 Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

4 <u>SECTION 1.</u> The position of School Nurse Specialist is created in the Department of Ed-5 ucation. The School Nurse Specialist must be a registered nurse licensed under ORS 678.010 6 to 678.410. The responsibilities of the School Nurse Specialist include, but are not limited to: 7 (1) Coordinating and collaborating with the State School Nursing Consultant within the

8 Oregon Health Authority to monitor, interpret, synthesize and disseminate information rel-9 evant to changes in health care, school nursing practices, law and regulations and other legal 10 issues that impact schools.

(2) Translating public health policy and guidance to effectively implement school health
services.

(3) Informing school policy and practice related to student health, including school
nursing and program guidance for the department and other state agencies.

(4) Supporting and leading the integration of coordinated school health teams and pro viding assistance in sustaining the teams.

(5) Providing technical assistance to department staff in the development of education
policy that reflects an understanding of how school health impacts learning.

(6) Identifying health-related barriers and supporting the creation of policy for the school
setting that:

(a) Incorporates evidence-based best practices in protocols and standards of care to
eliminate or minimize the impacts of health-related barriers;

23 (b) Improves access to school health services for underserved populations;

24 (c) Reduces chronic absenteeism; and

25 (d) Supports educational equity.

(7) Providing leadership in the delivery of nursing services in schools and an under standing of the requirements to implement and provide comprehensive communicable disease
management and integrated health services.

(8) Providing medical expertise to department staff for medical issues and needs related
to the provision of special education and related services, including 504 Plans, as defined in

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- 1 ORS 343.154, and individualized education programs, as defined in ORS 343.035.
- 2 (9) Serving as a liaison and expert resource in school health and school nursing programs
- 3 for local, regional and national educators and policymaking bodies.

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
