

Senate Bill 392

Sponsored by Senator DEMBROW (Pre-session filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Directs Department of Environmental Quality to study fugitive emissions from natural gas production and transportation and provide results of study and recommendations for legislation in report to interim committees of Legislative Assembly no later than September 15, 2022.

Sunset January 2, 2023.

Takes effect on 91st day following adjournment sine die.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

1
2 Relating to fugitive emissions; and prescribing an effective date.

3 **Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:**

4 **SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Environmental Quality shall study fugitive emissions**
5 **from the production and transportation of natural gas and make recommendations for leg-**
6 **islation to control fugitive emissions.**

7 **(2) The department shall provide the results of the study and recommendations in a re-**
8 **port to the appropriate interim committees of the Legislative Assembly in the manner pro-**
9 **vided under ORS 192.245 no later than September 15, 2022.**

10 **SECTION 2. Section 1 of this 2021 Act is repealed on January 2, 2023.**

11 **SECTION 3. This 2021 Act takes effect on the 91st day after the date on which the 2021**
12 **regular session of the Eighty-first Legislative Assembly adjourns sine die.**
