

Senate Bill 5506

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SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced**.

Limits for six-year period beginning July 1, 2021, payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by various state agencies for capital construction.

Limits for six-year period beginning July 1, 2021, payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by Higher Education Coordinating Commission for expenditures of bond proceeds for benefit of public universities and community colleges.

Sets expiration date on project approvals and expenditure limitations. Extends expiration dates for certain projects.

Declares emergency, effective July 1, 2021.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

Relating to state financial administration; and declaring an emergency.

Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:

SECTION 1. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the following amounts are established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limits for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Receipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the state agencies listed, for the acquisition of land and the acquisition, planning, constructing, altering, repairing, furnishing and equipping of buildings and facilities:

 - (b) **Gender Neutral Facilities and Mothers' Rooms..... \$ 10,000,000**
 - (c) **Capitol Mall Parking Structure Improvements \$ 2,750,000**

 - (e) **Climate Adaptation and Net Zero Solutions..... \$ 2,000,000**
 - (f) **Parking Lot Improvements and EV Charging Station Expansions..... \$ 2,000,000**
 - (g) **Acquisition and Disposition of State Property..... \$ 10,000,000**

22 **SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**
 23 **\$309,429,900 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit**
 24 **for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Re-**
 25 **ceipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Higher**
 26 **Education Coordinating Commission, for expenditures of proceeds from state bonds issued**
 27 **for the benefit of a public university, pursuant to agreements between the commission and**
 28 **a public university.**

29 **SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, the amount of**
 30 **\$32,500,000 is established for a six-year period beginning July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit**
 31 **for payment of expenses from fees, moneys or other revenues, including Miscellaneous Re-**
 32 **ceipts, but excluding lottery funds and federal funds, collected or received by the Higher**
 33 **Education Coordinating Commission, for expenditures of proceeds from state bonds issued**
 34 **for the benefit of a community college, pursuant to agreements between the commission and**
 35 **a community college.**

36 **SECTION 4. The project approvals and expenditure limitations in sections 1, 2 and 3 of**
 37 **this 2021 Act and the expenditure limitations established by the Emergency Board during the**
 38 **biennium beginning July 1, 2021, for capital construction or acquisition projects, expire on**
 39 **June 30, 2027, unless otherwise noted.**

40 **SECTION 5. The expiration dates of the project approvals and expenditure limitations**
 41 **authorized by the Legislative Assembly for the following projects are extended to the fol-**

18 **SECTION 6. This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public**
 19 **peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect**
 20 **July 1, 2021.**

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
