Senate Bill 676

Sponsored by Senator HEARD (Presession filed.)

SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.**

Requires state agencies to submit policy option proposals developed for purposes of Governor's budget to specified legislative leaders.

Declares emergency, effective on passage.

A BILL FOR AN ACT

- Relating to state agency budget information; amending ORS 291.204 and 291.208; and declaring an emergency.
- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon:
 - **SECTION 1.** ORS 291.204 is amended to read:
- 291.204. (1) The Oregon Department of Administrative Services, by July 1 of each even-numbered year, shall furnish every state agency with:
 - (a) Instructions for preparing for submission to the Governor the information required by the Governor in the preparation of the Governor's budget; and
 - (b) Instructions for preparing the proposed maximum supervisory ratio report required by ORS 291.227 (1).
 - (2) The Governor shall prescribe the instructions to be used by the agencies in submitting their agency request budgets as required by ORS 291.208. The instructions shall include direction to agencies that requires agencies to submit all policy option proposals to the legislative officials listed in ORS 291.208.
 - SECTION 2. ORS 291.208 is amended to read:
 - 291.208. (1) Each state agency shall file with the Oregon Department of Administrative Services, before September 1 in each even-numbered year in the manner required, an agency request budget containing the information required. The department shall prepare agency request budgets for all agencies that fail to file budgets.
 - (2) Each state agency shall file a copy of all policy option proposals submitted under subsection (1) of this section with the President of the Senate, the Speaker of the House of Representatives and with the majority and minority leaders of the Senate and the House of Representatives.
 - <u>SECTION 3.</u> This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2020 Act takes effect on its passage.

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
