SUMMARY

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure as introduced.

Alters commissioner composition of Higher Education Coordinating Commission by redesignating five current nonvoting positions as voting positions and by adding one additional position for graduate student attending public university.

- Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon: 4
- 5 SECTION 1. ORS 350.050 is amended to read:
- 6 350.050. (1) There is established a Higher Education Coordinating Commission, consisting of 7 [nine] 15 voting members appointed by the Governor.

- (a) One undergraduate student at a public university listed in ORS 352.002;
- (b) One graduate student at a public university listed in ORS 352.002;
- (c) One faculty member at a public university listed in ORS 352.002;
- (d) One student at a community college in this state;
 - (e) One faculty member at a community college in this state;
- 14 (f) One nonfaculty member of the staff from either a public university listed in ORS 352.002 or a community college; 15
 - [(a)] (g) One member from each of the five congressional districts in this state; and
 - [(b)] (h) Four members of the general public.
 - (3) [The Governor shall also appoint five nonvoting members to the commission.] The Governor shall elicit recommendations for appointments made under subsection (2)(a) to (f) of this section [this subsection] from official student, faculty and nonfaculty staff organizations at community colleges and public universities listed in ORS 352.002. [The five nonvoting members of the commission shall consist of:]
- 23 [(a) One student at a public university listed in ORS 352.002;]
- 24 [(b) One faculty member at a public university listed in ORS 352.002;]
- 25 [(c) One student at a community college in this state;]
- 26 [(d) One faculty member at a community college in this state; and]
- 27 [(e) One nonfaculty member of the staff from either a public university listed in ORS 352.002 or a 28 community college.]
- 29 (4) The term of office of each [voting] member appointed under subsection (2)(g) and (h) of this section is four years and the term of office for each [nonvoting] member appointed under

- subsection (2)(a) to (f) of this section is two years. A member serves at the pleasure of the Governor. Before the expiration of the term of a member, the Governor shall appoint a successor whose term begins on July 1 next following. A member is eligible for reappointment. If there is a vacancy for any cause, the Governor shall make an appointment to become immediately effective for the unexpired term.
- (5) The Governor may at any time, for cause, remove any member of the board that the Governor has appointed, after notice and public hearing, but not more than three members shall be removed within a period of four years, unless it is for corrupt conduct in office.
- (6) The appointment of [voting] members of the commission is subject to confirmation by the Senate in the manner prescribed in ORS 171.562 and 171.565.
- (7) A member of the commission is entitled to compensation and expenses as provided in ORS 292.495.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> The amendments to ORS 350.050 by section 1 of this 2021 Act apply to appointments to the Higher Education Coordinating Commission that are made on or after the effective date of this 2021 Act.
