## **Senate Joint Memorial 1**

Printed pursuant to Senate Interim Rule 213.28 by order of the President of the Senate in conformance with presession filing rules, indicating neither advocacy nor opposition on the part of the President (at the request of Senate Interim Committee on Education for Children's Institute)

## **SUMMARY**

The following summary is not prepared by the sponsors of the measure and is not a part of the body thereof subject to consideration by the Legislative Assembly. It is an editor's brief statement of the essential features of the measure **as introduced.** 

Urges Congress to enact legislation implementing internal Immigration and Customs Enforcement policy prohibiting enforcement actions in sensitive locations.

JOINT MEMORIAL

2	To the President of the United States, the Senate and the House of Representatives of the United
3	States of America, in Congress assembled, and the United States Secretary of Homeland Secu-
4	rity:
5	We, your memorialists, the Eighty-first Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon, in legisla-
6	tive session assembled, respectfully represent as follows:
7	Whereas 1 in 12 children in Oregon are United States citizens living with at least one undocu-
8	mented family member-more than 70,000 children; and
9	Whereas the future of Oregon is connected to the health, well-being and education of children
10	in immigrant families; and
11	Whereas immigrant families contribute to the economy, with undocumented workers across ma-
12	jor industries contributing over \$30 billion in federal and state taxes; and
13	Whereas children in stable families can thrive, but separation from parents, especially during
14	early childhood, has lasting impacts on children's growing brains; and
15	Whereas the stress caused by fear of being separated from parents puts children's growth and
16	development at risk; and
17	Whereas deportation of parents often causes emotional distress, poor physical and mental health
18	and poverty for children; and
19	Whereas fear of deportation of self, family members and friends adversely affects enrollment in
20	critical children's health and development supports, including the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance
21	Program and health, education and housing programs among documented and undocumented immi-
22	grants alike; and
23	Whereas early care and education programs report decreased enrollment, trouble filling empty
24	spaces, decreased parental participation and drops in attendance due to fears of deportation; and
25	Whereas fear of deportation increases distrust of local, state and federal law enforcement
26	throughout a child's life, while protection from deportation increases community safety; and
27	Whereas Black immigrants and their children are more likely to be impacted by immigration
28	enforcement; and
29	Whereas early childhood programs can have a positive impact on children of immigrants and

must be safe, consistent and nurturing places of learning for children and families; and

## Be It Resolved by the Legislative Assembly of the State of Oregon:

That we, the members of the Eighty-first Legislative Assembly, respectfully urge the Congress of the United States to pass, and the President to sign, legislation implementing the internal Immigration and Customs Enforcement policy that prohibits enforcement actions in sensitive locations; and be it further

Resolved, That a copy of this memorial shall be sent to the President of the United States, to the Senate Majority Leader, to the Speaker of the House of Representatives, to each member of the Oregon Congressional Delegation and to the United States Secretary of Homeland Security.
