PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2932

- On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 30 and delete page 2 and insert:
- 3 "SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:

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- "(a) 'Law enforcement unit' has the meaning given that term in ORS 181A.355.
- 6 "(b) 'Local correctional facility' has the meaning given that term 7 in ORS 169.005.
- 8 "(c) 'Peace officer' has the meaning given that term in ORS 161.015.
- "(2) The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall establish a statewide database of reports of the use of physical force by peace officers and deaths in custody of law enforcement units. The database must be searchable and available to the public.
 - "(3) For each instance in which a peace officer employed by a law enforcement unit uses physical force against an individual or threatens to use physical force against an individual, or when a death occurs while an individual is in the custody of a law enforcement unit, the law enforcement unit shall report to the commission and to the Federal Bureau of Investigation as soon as practicable, but no later than 72 hours after the use of force or death in custody:
- "(a) The following information about each officer who used or threatened to use physical force:

- 1 **"(A) Name.**
- 2 "(B) Certification number.
- **"(C) Race.**
- 4 "(D) Gender.
- 5 **"(E) Age.**
- 6 "(F) Height and weight.
- 7 "(G) Years of experience.
- 8 "(H) Whether the officer is a full-time or part-time employee.
- 9 "(I) Whether the officer was readily identifiable.
- 10 "(b) The certification numbers of all officers present at the incident 11 who did not use or threaten physical force.
- "(c) The date, time and location of the use or threat of physical force.
- 14 "(d) The perceived race, gender, age, religion, height and weight of 15 the person against whom physical force was used or threatened.
- 16 "(e) A description of the physical force used or threatened.
- "(f) A description of the severity of the physical force used or threatened.
- 19 "(g) A description of any injuries sustained by officers and persons 20 against whom physical force was used.
- 21 "(h) Whether the officer who used or threatened physical force was 22 on duty.
- 23 "(i) Whether the officer who used or threatened physical force used 24 a weapon or discharged a firearm.
- "(j) Whether the use or threat of physical force was investigated by the law enforcement unit or the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training, and the outcome of the investigation.
- 28 "(k) Whether a citizen complained about the use or threat of 29 physical force, and the outcome of the complaint.
- 30 "(L) Whether the law enforcement unit initiated the contact that

- ended in the use or threat of physical force. 1
 - "(m) Whether officers were ambushed.
- "(n) Whether a supervisor was present during the use or threat of 3 physical force. 4
- "(o) The reason for the presence of officers at the incident that 5 ended in the use or threat of physical force. 6
- "(p) Whether the person against whom physical force was used or 7 threatened resisted.
 - "(q) A description of any threats against officers or others made by the person against whom physical force was used or threatened.
 - "(r) Whether the person against whom physical force was used or threatened appeared to be impaired.
 - "(4) A law enforcement unit may not report to the commission the name, address, Social Security number or other unique personally identifiable information of a person against whom physical force was used or threatened.
 - "(5) At least once each calendar quarter, the Department of Corrections and a local correctional facility shall submit to the commission data related to deaths in custody collected under and on forms established by the Bureau of Justice Statistics of the United States Department of Justice in accordance with the federal Death in Custody Reporting Act (P.L. 113-242).
 - "(6) The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall report annually to an appropriate committee or interim committee of the Legislative Assembly on the reports received under this section, aggregated and broken down by law enforcement unit.".

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
