**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 2510**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “requirements” delete the rest
2 of the line and insert a period.

3 Delete lines 3 through 19.

4 On page 2, delete lines 1 through 12 and insert:

5 “Whereas statistical data from the National Safety Council and the Na-
6 tional Center for Health Statistics indicate that firearms are involved in 1.5
7 percent of accidental fatalities nationwide, far behind deaths due to motor
8 vehicle accidents (47 percent), falls (15 percent), poisonings (10 percent),
9 drownings (four percent), fires (three percent), suffocation on ingested ob-
10 jects (three percent) and other causes; and

11 “Whereas the syllabus of the opinion of the Supreme Court of the United
12 States in the case District of Columbia v. Heller states “The handgun ban
13 and the trigger-lock requirement (as applied to self-defense) violate the Sec-
14 ond Amendment’; and

15 “Whereas the syllabus of the opinion of the Supreme Court of the United
16 States in the case District of Columbia v. Heller states ‘Similarly, the re-
17 quirement that any lawful firearm in the home be disassembled or bound by a
18 trigger lock makes it impossible for citizens to use arms for the core lawful
19 purpose of self-defense and is hence unconstitutional’; now, therefore,”.

20 Delete lines 14 through 45 and delete pages 3 through 6 and insert:

21 **“SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Education shall by rule develop**

1 a firearm safety education curriculum for students in grades 7 through
2 9.

3 “(2) Each school district shall ensure that students in grades 7
4 through 9 receive instruction in accordance with the firearm safety
5 education curriculum described in subsection (1) of this section.

6 “(3) The department or a school district may contract with an out-
7 side entity to develop the curriculum or provide the instruction de-
8 scribed in this section.

9 “SECTION 2. Notwithstanding any other law, a person who lawfully
10 owns a firearm and stores the firearm inside the person’s home is
11 safely and lawfully storing the firearm.

12 “SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law, a person who lawfully
13 owns a firearm and stores the firearm inside the person’s motor ve-
14 hicle, in accordance with ORS 166.250 and while the person is inside
15 the vehicle, is safely and lawfully storing the firearm.”.
