**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
HOUSE BILL 2746**

1 Delete lines 4 through 27 of the printed bill and insert:

2 **“SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Justice shall develop, imple-**
3 **ment and administer a statewide Hope Card Program for the issuance**
4 **of information cards regarding eligible civil protection orders.**

5 **“(2) The department, by rule, shall establish eligibility requirements**
6 **for eligible civil protection orders.**

7 **“(3) Upon request, the Hope Card Program shall provide one or**
8 **more information cards to a person protected by an eligible civil pro-**
9 **tection order.**

10 **“(4) An information card issued under this section must be a dura-**
11 **ble, wallet-sized card containing essential information about the civil**
12 **protection order, including the persons protected and subject to the**
13 **order, the court case number and jurisdiction, the issuance and expi-**
14 **ration dates of the order and any other information prescribed by the**
15 **department by rule.**

16 **“(5) The Hope Card Program may not charge a fee for an applica-**
17 **tion for or the issuance of an information card under this section.**

18 **“(6) The department, in consultation with Oregon Indian tribes, the**
19 **Oregon State Police, the State Court Administrator, representatives**
20 **of victim service organizations and other appropriate entities, shall**
21 **adopt rules for the administration of the Hope Card Program.**

1 **“SECTION 2. (1) Section 1 of this 2021 Act becomes operative on**
2 **July 1, 2022.**

3 **“(2) The Department of Justice may take any action before the op-**
4 **erative date specified in subsection (1) of this section that is necessary**
5 **for the department to exercise, on or after the operative date specified**
6 **in subsection (1) of this section, all of the duties, functions and powers**
7 **conferred on the department by section 1 of this 2021 Act.”.**
