PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 183

On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after "courts;" delete the rest of the line and insert "amending ORS 24.105, 24.190, 133.310 and 133.315.".

3 Delete lines 4 through 30 and delete pages 2 through 4 and insert:

4 "SECTION 1. ORS 24.105 is amended to read:

5 "24.105. In ORS 24.105 to 24.125, 24.135 and 24.155 to 24.175, 'foreign 6 judgment' means:

"(1) Any judgment, decree or order of a court of the United States or of
any other court which is entitled to full faith and credit in this state; and
"(2) Any judgment, decree or order of a tribal court of a federally

recognized Indian tribe, except when another Oregon statute provides
 a different process to enforce a tribal judgment, decree or order, or
 as provided in ORS 426.180.

13 **"SECTION 2.** ORS 24.190 is amended to read:

¹⁴ "24.190. (1) For the purposes of this section:

"(a) 'Foreign restraining order' means a restraining order that is a foreign
 judgment as defined by ORS 24.105.

"(b)(A) 'Restraining order' means an injunction or other order issued for
the purpose of preventing:

¹⁹ "(i) Violent or threatening acts or harassment against another person;

20 "(ii) Sexual violence against another person;

21 "[(*ii*)] (**iii**) Contact or communication with another person; or

1 "[(*iii*)] (**iv**) Physical proximity to another person.

"(B) 'Restraining order' includes temporary and final orders[, other than support or child custody orders,] issued by a civil or criminal court regardless of whether the order was obtained by filing an independent action or as a pendente lite order in another proceeding. However, for a civil order to be considered a restraining order, the civil order must have been issued in response to a complaint, petition or motion filed by or on behalf of a person seeking protection.

9 "(2)(a) Except as otherwise provided in paragraph (b) of this subsection, 10 immediately upon the arrival in this state of a person protected by a foreign 11 restraining order, the foreign restraining order is enforceable as an Oregon 12 order without the necessity of filing and continues to be enforceable as an 13 Oregon order without any further action by the protected person.

"(b) A foreign restraining order is not enforceable as an Oregon order if:
"(A) The person restrained by the order shows that:

"(i) The court that issued the order lacked jurisdiction over the subject
 matter or lacked personal jurisdiction over the person restrained by the or der; or

"(ii) The person restrained by the order was not given reasonable notice and an opportunity to be heard under the law of the jurisdiction in which the order was issued; or

"(B) The foreign restraining order was issued against a person who had
 petitioned for a restraining order unless:

"(i) The person protected by the foreign restraining order filed a separate
 petition seeking the restraining order; and

"(ii) The court issuing the foreign restraining order made specific findings
that the person was entitled to the order.

"(c) Except as otherwise expressly provided in the order, issues of
 nonenforceability described in paragraph (b) of this subsection are af firmative defenses in an action seeking enforcement of the order.

"[(3)(a) A person protected by a foreign restraining order may present a true 1 copy of the order to a county sheriff for entry into the Law Enforcement Data $\mathbf{2}$ System maintained by the Department of State Police. Subject to paragraph 3 (b) of this subsection, the county sheriff shall enter the order into the Law 4 Enforcement Data System if the person certifies that the order is the most re- $\mathbf{5}$ cent order in effect between the parties and provides proof of service or other 6 written certification that the person restrained by the order has been personally 7 served with a copy of the order or has actual notice of the order. Entry into 8 the Law Enforcement Data System constitutes notice to all law enforcement 9 agencies of the existence of the restraining order. Law enforcement agencies 10 shall establish procedures adequate to ensure that an officer at the scene of 11 an alleged violation of the order may be informed of the existence and terms 12 of the order. The order is fully enforceable as an Oregon order in any county 13 or tribal land in this state.] 14

"(3)(a) A person may present a copy of a foreign restraining order 15to a county sheriff for entry into the Law Enforcement Data System 16 maintained by the Department of State Police. Subject to paragraph 17 (b) of this subsection, and after promptly verifying the validity of the 18 foreign restraining order and that the person restrained by the order 19 has been personally served with a copy of the order or has actual no-20tice of the order, the county sheriff shall enter the order into the Law 21**Enforcement Data System and the National Crime Information Center** 22of the United States Department of Justice. Entry into the Law 23Enforcement Data System or the National Crime Information Center 24constitutes notice to all law enforcement agencies of the existence of 25the restraining order. Law enforcement agencies shall establish pro-26cedures adequate to ensure that an officer at the scene of an alleged 27violation of the order may be informed of the existence and terms of 28the order. The order is fully enforceable as an Oregon order in any 29 county or tribal land in this state. 30

"(b) The Department of State Police shall specify information that is required for a foreign restraining order to be entered into the Law Enforcement Data System.

"[(c) At the time a county sheriff enters an order into the Law Enforcement
Data System under paragraph (a) of this subsection, the sheriff shall also enter
the order into the databases of the National Crime Information Center of the
United States Department of Justice.]

8 "(c) As used in this subsection, 'personal service' and 'actual 9 notice' include alternative forms of service or notice that are permit-10 ted by the issuing jurisdiction to constitute service or notice.

"(4) Pending a contempt hearing for alleged violation of a foreign restraining order, a person arrested and taken into custody pursuant to ORS 133.310 may be released as provided in ORS 135.230 to 135.290. Unless the order provides otherwise, the security amount for release is \$5,000.

"(5) ORS 24.115, 24.125, 24.129, 24.135, 24.140, 24.150 and 24.155 do not apply to a foreign restraining order.

"(6) A person protected by a foreign restraining order, or a person act-17 ing on behalf of a person protected by a foreign restraining order, may 18 file a certified copy of the order and proof of service in the office of the clerk 19 of any circuit court of any county of this state. A judgment [so filed] or 20order filed under this subsection has the same effect and is subject to the 21same procedures, defenses and proceedings for reopening, vacating or staying 22as a judgment **or order** of the circuit court in which the foreign judgment 23or order is filed, and may be enforced or satisfied in like manner. The court 24may not collect a filing fee for a filing under this [section] subsection. 25

"(7) This state or a local governmental agency, or a law enforcement officer, prosecuting attorney, clerk of the court or any state or local governmental official acting in an official capacity, is immune from civil and criminal liability for an act arising out of the registration, entry or enforcement of a foreign restraining order or the detention or arrest of an alleged violator of a foreign restraining order
if the act was done in good faith and without malice in an effort to
comply with state and federal law.

4 "SECTION 3. ORS 133.310 is amended to read:

"133.310. (1) A peace officer may arrest a person without a warrant if the
officer has probable cause to believe that the person has committed any of
the following:

8 "(a) A felony.

9 "(b) A misdemeanor.

"(c) An unclassified offense for which the maximum penalty allowed by
law is equal to or greater than the maximum penalty allowed for a Class C
misdemeanor.

13 "(d) Any other crime committed in the officer's presence.

"(2) A peace officer may arrest a person without a warrant when the peace officer is notified by telegraph, telephone, radio or other mode of communication by another peace officer of any state that there exists a duly issued warrant for the arrest of a person within the other peace officer's jurisdiction.

19 "(3) A peace officer shall arrest and take into custody a person without 20 a warrant when the peace officer has probable cause to believe that:

"(a) There exists an order issued pursuant to ORS 30.866, 107.095 (1)(c)
or (d), 107.716, 107.718, 124.015, 124.020, 133.035, 163.738, 163.765, 163.767 or
419B.845 restraining the person;

"(b) A true copy of the order and proof of service on the person has been
filed as required in ORS 107.720, 124.030, 133.035, 163.741, 163.773 or 419B.845;
and

27 "(c) The person to be arrested has violated the terms of that order.

"(4) A peace officer shall arrest and take into custody a person without
a warrant if:

30 "(a) The person protected by a foreign restraining order as defined by

6 "(b) The peace officer has probable cause to believe that the person to 7 be arrested has violated the terms of the foreign restraining order.

"(5) A peace officer shall arrest and take into custody a person without
a warrant if:

"[(a) The person protected by a foreign restraining order as defined by ORS 24.190 has filed a copy of the foreign restraining order with a court or has been identified by the officer as a party protected by a foreign restraining order entered in the Law Enforcement Data System or in the databases of the National Crime Information Center of the United States Department of Justice; and]

"(a) A foreign restraining order as defined by ORS 24.190 has been
filed with a court or has been entered into the Law Enforcement Data
System or in the databases of the National Crime Information Center
of the United States Department of Justice; and

20 "(b) The peace officer has probable cause to believe that the person to 21 be arrested has violated the terms of the foreign restraining order.

"(6) A peace officer shall arrest and take into custody a person without
a warrant if the peace officer has probable cause to believe:

"(a) The person has been charged with an offense and is presently released as to that charge under ORS 135.230 to 135.290; and

26 "(b) The person has failed to comply with a no contact condition of the 27 release agreement.

"133.315. (1) No peace officer shall be held criminally or civilly liable for
making an arrest pursuant to ORS 133.055 (2) or 133.310 (3) or (5) provided

1 the peace officer acts in good faith and without malice.

"(2) No peace officer shall be criminally or civilly liable for any arrest
made under ORS 133.310 (4) if the officer reasonably believes that:

"(a) A physical or electronic document or other writing supplied to the
officer under ORS 133.310 (4) is an accurate copy of a foreign restraining
order as defined by ORS 24.190 and is the most recent order in effect between
the parties; and

"(b) The person restrained by the order has been personally served witha copy of the order or has actual notice of the order.".

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
