PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2241

On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 29 and delete page 2 and insert:

"SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Environmental Quality shall create and maintain a publicly available list of two or more businesses that may provide the services described in subsection (2) of this section. The businesses identified by the department under this subsection must be experienced in laws and practices relating to water pollution and be capable of providing services to a sufficient number of applicants, as determined by the department. The department may periodically update the list created under this section.

- "(2) A business identified by the department under subsection (1) of this section may offer to perform the following services for data centers as defined in ORS 308.505 that are applicants for an NPDES permit for the discharge of noncontact cooling water:
 - "(a) Review the permit application;
- "(b) Prepare a report to the department based on the standards established by the department under subsection (3) of this section; and
 - "(c) Transmit the permit application and report to the department.
- "(3) The department shall establish standards for the preparation and transmittal to the department of a report under subsection (2) of this section. The standards established under this subsection must, at

- "(a) The person that prepares the report apply the same criteria as an employee of the department for determining whether the applicant has met the requirements for a permit;
- 5 "(b) The report state whether the permit application is complete;
- "(c) The report state whether, based on the criteria described in paragraph (a) of this subsection, the permit application meets the criteria for approval; and
 - "(d) If the permit application meets the criteria for approval, the report include a draft permit and a fact sheet, if required, for review by the department.
 - "(4) Except as provided in subsection (5)(b) of this section, if the department receives a permit application and report as described in subsection (2) of this section, the department shall approve or disapprove the permit application within 120 days of receiving the permit application and report.
 - "(5)(a) If either a permit application or report received by the department under subsection (2) of this section is incomplete, the department may request additional information from the business that submitted the permit application and report or from the applicant. The department must identify in the request the information needed to complete the permit application or report.
 - "(b) If the department makes a request for additional information, the department shall approve or disapprove the permit application within 120 days of receiving the information needed to complete the permit application or report.
 - (6) A data center may not utilize the process described in subsection(2) of this section during any period when the department is accepting applications for NPDES 100-J general permits.
 - "SECTION 2. No later than September 15 of each year, the Depart-

- ment of Environmental Quality shall submit a report to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related to the environment in the manner provided under ORS 192.245. The report must include:
- (1) The average time between receipt of an application under section 1 of this 2021 Act and a final decision on the application;
 - (2) The average time between receipt of a water quality permit application for the discharge of noncontact cooling water solely reviewed by the department and a final decision on the application; and
 - (3) For permits described in subsection (2) of this section:
- (a) An analysis of whether the wait times for permits is increasing
 or decreasing; and
 - (b) A description of any efforts taken by the department to decrease wait times.
 - "SECTION 3. The Department of Environmental Quality shall identify at least three businesses that may provide the services described in section 1 (2) of this 2021 Act within 180 days of the effective date of this 2021 Act.
 - "SECTION 4. Sections 1 and 2 of this 2021 Act are repealed on January 2, 2032.
 - "SECTION 5. This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect on its passage."
