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## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2932

- On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 4 through 30 and delete page 2 and insert:
- 3 "SECTION 1. (1) As used in this section:
- "(a) 'Law enforcement unit' has the meaning given that term in ORS 181A.355, except that 'law enforcement unit' does not include a tribal government.
- "(b) 'Local correctional facility' has the meaning given that term 8 in ORS 169.005.
- "(c) 'Peace officer' has the meaning given that term in ORS 161.015, except that 'peace officer' does not include an authorized tribal police officer as defined in ORS 181A.680.
  - "(2) The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall establish a statewide database of reports of the use of physical force by peace officers and deaths in custody of law enforcement units. The database must be searchable and available to the public.
- "(3) For each instance in which a peace officer employed by a law enforcement unit uses physical force against an individual, or when a death occurs while an individual is in the custody of a law enforcement unit, the law enforcement unit shall submit a report under penalty of perjury to the commission and to the Federal Bureau of Investigation as soon as practicable, but no later than 72 hours after

- 1 the use of force or death in custody:
- "(a) The following information about the use of force or death in custody:
- "(A) The date and time of the use of physical force or death in custody.
- 6 "(B) The location of the use of physical force or death in custody 7 and a brief description of the location.
- 8 "(C) The total number of officers who used physical force, and the 9 number of officers employed by the law enforcement unit who used 10 physical force.
- 11 "(D) Whether an officer approached the person against whom 12 physical force was used.
  - "(E) Whether officers were ambushed.

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- 14 "(F) A description of any weapons involved in the incident.
- 15 "(G) Whether officers consulted supervisors or senior officers dur-16 ing the incident.
- 17 "(H) The reason for the initial contact with the person against 18 whom physical force was used.
- "(I) If the reason for the initial contact was illegal activity, the most serious offense that the person against whom physical force was used was suspected of.
- 22 "(J) Whether the incident was investigated by the law enforcement 23 unit.
- "(K) Whether a complaint was filed against any officer involved in the incident.
- "(L) If available, the National Incident-Based Reporting System record or local incident number of the report detailing criminal incident information or assault or homicide of an officer.
- "(M) If the incident involved multiple law enforcement units, the case numbers for the other units' incident reports.

- "(b) The following information about the person against whom force was used or the person who died in custody:
- "(A) The age, sex, race, ethnicity, height and weight of the person.
- 4 "(B) A description of the injuries sustained by the person.
- 5 "(C) A description of the physical force used.
- 6 "(D) Whether the person threatened an officer or another person.
- 7 "(E) Whether the person resisted.
- 8 "(F) Whether the person had a known or apparent impairment, in-
- 9 cluding but not limited to mental health conditions and being under 10 the influence of drugs or alcohol.
- "(G) Whether the person was believed to have a weapon.
- 12 "(c) The following information about each officer involved in the 13 use of physical force or death in custody:
- 14 "(A) Name.
- 15 "(B) Certification number.
- 16 **"(C) Race.**
- 17 "(D) Ethnicity.
- **"(E) Gender.**
- 19 **"(F) Age.**
- 20 "(G) Sex.
- 21 "(H) Height and weight.
- 22 "(I) Years of experience.
- 23 "(J) Whether the officer is a full-time or part-time employee.
- 24 "(K) Whether the officer was on duty at the time of the incident.
- 25 "(L) Whether the officer discharged a firearm.
- 26 "(M) A description of any injuries sustained by the officer in the incident.
- "(4) A law enforcement unit may not report to the commission the name, address, Social Security number or other unique personally identifiable information of a person against whom physical force was

used. 1

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"(5) At least once each calendar quarter, the Department of Cor-2 rections and a local correctional facility shall submit to the commission data related to deaths in custody collected under and on forms established by the Bureau of Justice Statistics of the United States Department of Justice in accordance with the federal Death in Custody Reporting Act (P.L. 113-242).

"(6) The Oregon Criminal Justice Commission shall report annually to an appropriate committee or interim committee of the Legislative Assembly on the reports received under this section, aggregated and broken down by law enforcement unit.".

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
