PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 3124

- On page 1 of the printed bill, delete lines 5 through 29.
- On page 2, delete lines 1 through 35 and insert:
- **"SECTION 1.** ORS 203.079 is amended to read:
- 4 "203.079. (1) A policy developed pursuant to ORS 203.077 shall [include,
- 5 but is not limited to,] conform, but is not limited, to the following[:]
- 6 provisions.
- 7 "(2) As used in this section, 'personal property' means any item
- 8 that can reasonably be identified as belonging to an individual and
- 9 that has apparent value or utility.
- "[(a)] (3) [Prior to] Except as provided in subsection (9) of this sec-
- tion, at least 72 hours before removing homeless individuals from an es-
- tablished camping site, law enforcement officials shall post a written notice,
- [13] [written] in English and Spanish, [24 hours in advance] at all entrances to
- 14 the camping site to the extent that the entrances can reasonably be
- 15 **identified**.
- "(b)] (4)(a) [At the time that a 24-hour] When a 72-hour notice is posted,
- 17 law enforcement officials shall inform the local agency that delivers social
- services to homeless individuals **as to** where the notice has been posted.
- "(c)] (b) The local agency may arrange for outreach workers to visit the
- 20 camping site [where a notice has been posted] that is subject to the notice
- to assess the need for social service assistance in arranging shelter and other

- 1 assistance.
- "[(d)] (5)(a) All [unclaimed] personal property at the camping site that
- 3 remains unclaimed after removal shall be given to [law enforcement offi-
- 4 cials whether 24-hour] a law enforcement official, a local agency that
- 5 delivers social services to homeless individuals, an outreach worker,
- a local agency official or a person authorized to issue a citation de-
- 7 scribed in subsection (10) of this section, whether notice is required
- 8 under subsection (3) of this section or not.
- 9 "(b) The unclaimed personal property must be stored in a facility
- 10 located in the same community as the camping site from which it was
- 11 removed.
- "(c) Items that have no apparent value or utility or are in an in-
- 13 sanitary condition may be immediately discarded upon removal of the
- 14 homeless individuals from the camping site.
- 15 "(d) Weapons, drug paraphernalia and items that appear to be ei-
- ther stolen or evidence of a crime shall be given to or retained by law
- 17 enforcement officials.
- 18 "(6) The written notice required under subsection (3) of this section
- 19 must state, at a minimum:
- 20 "(a) Where unclaimed personal property will be stored;
- 21 "(b) A phone number that individuals may call to find out where
- 22 the property will be stored; or
- 23 "(c) If a permanent storage location has not yet been determined,
- 24 the address and phone number of an agency that will have the infor-
- 25 mation when available.
- 26 "(7)(a) The unclaimed personal property shall be stored in an or-
- 27 derly fashion, keeping items that belong to an individual together to
- 28 the extent that ownership can reasonably be determined.
- 29 "(b) The property shall be stored for a minimum of 30 days during which
- 30 it [will] **shall** be reasonably available to any individual claiming ownership.

- 1 Any personal property that remains unclaimed [for] after 30 days may be
- 2 disposed of. [For purposes of this paragraph, 'personal property' means any
- 3 item that is reasonably recognizable as belonging to a person and that has
- 4 apparent utility. Items that have no apparent utility or are in an insanitary
- 5 condition may be immediately discarded upon removal of the homeless indi-
- 6 viduals from the camping site. Weapons, drug paraphernalia and items that
- 7 appear to be either stolen or evidence of a crime shall be given to law
- 8 enforcement officials.]
- 9 "[(e)] (8) Following the removal of homeless individuals from a camping
- site on public property, the law enforcement officials, local agency officials
- and outreach workers may meet to assess the notice and removal policy, to
- 12 discuss whether the removals are occurring in a humane and just manner
- and to determine if any changes are needed in the policy.
 - "[(2)] (9) The [24-hour] 72-hour notice [required] requirement under
- subsection [(1)] (3) of this section [shall] does not apply:
- "(a) When there are grounds for law enforcement officials to believe that
 - illegal activities other than camping are occurring at an established
- 18 camping site.

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- "(b) In the event of an exceptional emergency [such as] at an established
- camping site, including, but not limited to, possible site contamination
- by hazardous materials [or when there is], a public health emergency or
- other immediate danger to human life or safety.
- 23 "[(3)] (10) A person authorized to issue a citation for unlawful camping
- 24 under state law, administrative rule or city or county ordinance may not
- issue the citation if the citation would be issued within 200 feet of [the] a
- 26 notice [described in] required under subsection (3) of this section and
- 27 within two hours before or after the notice was posted.
- 28 "(11) Any law or policy of a city or county that is more specific or
- offers greater protections to homeless individuals subject to removal
- 30 from an established camping site preempts contrary provisions of this

1 section.".
