**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 758**

1 On page 1 of the printed bill, line 2, after “475B.020,” delete the rest of
2 the line and delete lines 3 through 6 and insert “475B.220, 475B.431, 475B.570,
3 475B.630, 475B.707, 475B.759, 475B.788, 475B.791, 475B.797, 475B.801, 475B.810,
4 475B.822, 475B.831, 475B.834, 475B.837, 475B.840, 475B.858, 475B.879, 475B.885,
5 475B.895, 475B.898, 475B.901, 475B.904, 475B.913, 475B.916, 475B.952 and
6 475B.961 and section 5, chapter 2, Oregon Laws 2021 (Ballot Measure 110
7 (2020)); repealing ORS 475B.794, 475B.816, 475B.819, 475B.843 and 475B.861;
8 and prescribing an effective date.”.

9 Delete lines 8 through 18 and delete pages 2 through 28 and insert:

11 **“OREGON MEDICAL AND THERAPEUTIC CANNABIS ACT**
12

13 **“SECTION 1. Sections 2 to 4 of this 2021 Act are added to and made**
14 **a part of ORS 475B.785 to 475B.949.**

15 **“SECTION 2. (1)(a) A person designated to produce marijuana by a**
16 **registry identification cardholder may transfer, pursuant to an agree-**
17 **ment entered into with the registry identification cardholder and sub-**
18 **ject to the limits established in ORS 475B.825, 475B.831 and 475B.834,**
19 **all or part of the seeds, immature marijuana plants and usable**
20 **marijuana associated with the production of marijuana described in**
21 **this subsection to another registry identification cardholder or the**

1 other registry identification cardholder’s designated primary
2 caregiver.

3 “(b) A person may enter into an agreement under this section in
4 addition to an agreement described in ORS 475B.822.

5 “(2) A transfer made under this section is subject to tracking under
6 ORS 475B.895.

7 “(3) The Oregon Health Authority may adopt rules to carry out this
8 section.

9 **“SECTION 3.** The Oregon Health Authority shall include on a
10 website dedicated to the authority and on a website dedicated to the
11 program administered under ORS 475B.785 to 475B.949 a statement de-
12 claring that cannabis is to be treated as a medicine for Oregonians of
13 all ages, the program administered under ORS 475B.785 to 475B.949 is
14 a public health program and the authority is dedicated to ensuring
15 equitable access to the program for all Oregonians. The authority shall
16 adopt and abide by internal policies that focus on ensuring equitable
17 access to the program for all Oregonians.

18 **“SECTION 4.** The Oregon Health Authority shall, in consultation
19 with the Oregon Liquor Control Commission and other state agencies
20 as necessary:

21 “(1) Ensure the highest level of protection and privacy for infor-
22 mation submitted and maintained in the databases established under
23 ORS 475B.879 and 475B.882, the electronic system established under
24 ORS 475B.892 and the tracking system established under ORS 475B.177;

25 “(2) Continually revise information handling and submission pro-
26 cesses to reduce multiple submissions of personally identifiable infor-
27 mation in the databases established under ORS 475B.879 and 475B.882,
28 the electronic system established under ORS 475B.892 and the tracking
29 system established under ORS 475B.177; and

30 “(3) Ensure any third party vendors with which the authority or the

1 **commission contracts for the management of the databases estab-**
2 **lished under ORS 475B.879 and 475B.882, the electronic system estab-**
3 **lished under ORS 475B.892 and the tracking system established under**
4 **ORS 475B.177 prevent cybersecurity breaches.**

5 **“SECTION 5.** ORS 475B.788 is amended to read:

6 “475B.788. ORS 475B.785 to 475B.949 shall be known as the Oregon Med-
7 ical [*Marijuana*] **and Therapeutic Cannabis Act.**

8 **“SECTION 6.** ORS 475B.791 is amended to read:

9 “475B.791. As used in ORS 475B.785 to 475B.949:

10 “(1) ‘Attending [*physician*] **provider**’ means [*a physician licensed under*
11 *ORS chapter 677 who has primary responsibility for the care and treatment*
12 *of a person diagnosed with a debilitating medical condition*] **a licensed**
13 **health care provider who has within the provider’s scope of practice**
14 **and licensure the authority to prescribe prescription drugs, as that**
15 **term is defined in ORS 689.005.**

16 “(2) ‘Cannabinoid’ means any of the chemical compounds that are the
17 active constituents of marijuana.

18 “(3) ‘Cannabinoid concentrate’ means a substance obtained by separating
19 cannabinoids from marijuana by:

20 “(a) A mechanical extraction process;

21 “(b) A chemical extraction process using a nonhydrocarbon-based solvent,
22 such as vegetable glycerin, vegetable oils, animal fats, isopropyl alcohol or
23 ethanol;

24 “(c) A chemical extraction process using the hydrocarbon-based solvent
25 carbon dioxide, provided that the process does not involve the use of high
26 heat or pressure; or

27 “(d) Any other process identified by the Oregon Health Authority, in
28 consultation with the Oregon Liquor Control Commission, by rule.

29 “(4) ‘Cannabinoid edible’ means food or potable liquid into which a
30 cannabinoid concentrate, cannabinoid extract or dried leaves or flowers of

1 marijuana have been incorporated.

2 “(5) ‘Cannabinoid extract’ means a substance obtained by separating
3 cannabinoids from marijuana by:

4 “(a) A chemical extraction process using a hydrocarbon-based solvent,
5 such as butane, hexane or propane;

6 “(b) A chemical extraction process using the hydrocarbon-based solvent
7 carbon dioxide, if the process uses high heat or pressure; or

8 “(c) Any other process identified by the Oregon Health Authority, in
9 consultation with the Oregon Liquor Control Commission, by rule.

10 “(6) ‘Debilitating medical condition’ means:

11 “(a) Cancer, glaucoma, a degenerative or pervasive neurological condi-
12 tion, positive status for human immunodeficiency virus or acquired immune
13 deficiency syndrome, or a side effect related to the treatment of those med-
14 ical conditions;

15 “(b) A medical condition or treatment for a medical condition that
16 produces, for a specific patient, one or more of the following:

17 “(A) Cachexia;

18 “(B) Severe pain;

19 “(C) Severe nausea;

20 “(D) Seizures, including seizures caused by epilepsy; or

21 “(E) Persistent muscle spasms, including spasms caused by multiple
22 sclerosis;

23 “(c) Post-traumatic stress disorder, **presumptive post-traumatic stress**
24 **disorder based on the person’s history of arrest or imprisonment or a**
25 **medical condition related to post-traumatic stress disorder, including:**

26 “(A) **Chronic anxiety; and**

27 “(B) **Chronic depression; or**

28 “(d) Any other medical condition or side effect related to the treatment
29 of a medical condition adopted by the Oregon Health Authority by rule
30 [or], approved by the authority pursuant to a petition filed under ORS

1 475B.946 or as determined by an attending provider in the professional
2 judgment and ongoing medical oversight of the attending provider.

3 “(7)(a) ‘Delivery’ has the meaning given that term in ORS 475.005.

4 “(b) ‘Delivery’ does not include transfer of marijuana by a registry iden-
5 tification cardholder to another registry identification cardholder if no con-
6 sideration is paid for the transfer.

7 “(8)(a) ‘Designated primary caregiver’ means an individual:

8 “(A) Who is 18 years of age or older;

9 “(B) Who has significant responsibility for managing the well-being of a
10 person who has been diagnosed with a debilitating medical condition; and

11 “(C) Who is designated as the person responsible for managing the well-
12 being of a person who has been diagnosed with a debilitating medical con-
13 dition on that person’s application for a registry identification card or in
14 other written notification submitted to the authority.

15 “(b) ‘Designated primary caregiver’ does not include a person’s attending
16 [*physician*] **provider**.

17 “(9) ‘High heat’ means a temperature exceeding 180 degrees.

18 “(10) ‘Immature marijuana plant’ means a marijuana plant that is not
19 flowering.

20 “(11)(a) ‘Marijuana’ means the plant Cannabis family Cannabaceae, any
21 part of the plant Cannabis family Cannabaceae and the seeds of the plant
22 Cannabis family Cannabaceae.

23 “(b) ‘Marijuana’ does not include:

24 “(A) Industrial hemp, as defined in ORS 571.269; or

25 “(B) Prescription drugs, as that term is defined in ORS 689.005, including
26 those containing one or more cannabinoids, that are approved by the United
27 States Food and Drug Administration and dispensed by a pharmacy, as de-
28 fined in ORS 689.005.

29 “(12) ‘Marijuana grow site’ means a location registered under ORS
30 475B.810 where marijuana is produced for use by a registry identification

1 cardholder.

2 “(13) ‘Marijuana processing site’ means a marijuana processing site reg-
3 istered under ORS 475B.840 or a site for which an applicant has submitted
4 an application for registration under ORS 475B.840.

5 “(14) ‘Mature marijuana plant’ means a marijuana plant that is not an
6 immature marijuana plant.

7 “(15)(a) ‘Medical cannabinoid product’ means a cannabinoid edible and
8 any other product intended for human consumption or use, including a
9 product intended to be applied to a person’s skin or hair, that contains
10 cannabinoids or dried leaves or flowers of marijuana.

11 “(b) ‘Medical cannabinoid product’ does not include:

12 “(A) Usable marijuana by itself;

13 “(B) A cannabinoid concentrate by itself;

14 “(C) A cannabinoid extract by itself; or

15 “(D) Industrial hemp, as defined in ORS 571.269.

16 “(16) ‘Medical marijuana dispensary’ means a medical marijuana
17 dispensary registered under ORS 475B.858 or a site for which an applicant
18 has submitted an application for registration under ORS 475B.858.

19 “(17) ‘Medical use of marijuana’ means the production, processing, pos-
20 session, delivery or administration of marijuana, or use of paraphernalia
21 used to administer marijuana, to mitigate the symptoms or effects of a de-
22 bilitating medical condition.

23 “(18) ‘Person designated to produce marijuana by a registry identification
24 cardholder’ means a person designated to produce marijuana by a registry
25 identification cardholder under ORS 475B.810 who produces marijuana for a
26 registry identification cardholder at an address other than the address where
27 the registry identification cardholder resides or at an address where more
28 than 12 mature marijuana plants are produced.

29 “(19) ‘Process’ means the compounding or conversion of marijuana into
30 medical cannabinoid products, cannabinoid concentrates or cannabinoid ex-

1 tracts.

2 “(20) ‘Production’ means:

3 “(a) Planting, cultivating, growing, trimming or harvesting marijuana; or

4 “(b) Drying marijuana leaves or flowers.

5 “(21) ‘Registry identification card’ means a document issued by the
6 Oregon Health Authority under ORS 475B.797 that identifies a person au-
7 thorized to engage in the medical use of marijuana and, if the person has a
8 designated primary caregiver under ORS 475B.804, the person’s designated
9 primary caregiver.

10 “(22) ‘Registry identification cardholder’ means a person to whom a reg-
11 istry identification card has been issued under ORS 475B.797.

12 “(23)(a) ‘Usable marijuana’ means the dried leaves and flowers of
13 marijuana.

14 “(b) ‘Usable marijuana’ does not include:

15 “(A) The seeds, stalks and roots of marijuana; or

16 “(B) Waste material that is a by-product of producing marijuana.

17 “(24) ‘Written documentation’ means a statement signed by the attending
18 [*physician*] **provider** of a person diagnosed with a debilitating medical con-
19 dition or copies of the person’s relevant medical records.

20 “**SECTION 7.** ORS 475B.797 is amended to read:

21 “475B.797. (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall establish a program for
22 the issuance of registry identification cards to applicants who meet the re-
23 quirements of this section.

24 “(2) The authority shall issue a registry identification card to an appli-
25 cant who is 18 years of age or older if the applicant pays a fee in an amount
26 established by the authority by rule and submits to the authority an appli-
27 cation containing the following information:

28 “(a) Written documentation from the applicant’s attending [*physician*]
29 **provider** stating that the attending [*physician*] **provider** has diagnosed the
30 applicant as having a debilitating medical condition and that the medical

1 use of marijuana may mitigate the symptoms or effects of the applicant’s
2 debilitating medical condition;

3 “(b) The name, address and date of birth of the applicant;

4 “(c) The name, address and telephone number of the applicant’s attending
5 [*physician*] **provider**;

6 “[*d*] *Proof of residency, submitted in a form required by the authority by*
7 *rule;*]

8 “[*e*] **(d)** The name and address of the applicant’s designated primary
9 caregiver, if the applicant is designating a primary caregiver under ORS
10 475B.804; and

11 “[*f*] **(e)** The information described in ORS 475B.810 (2), if the applicant
12 is applying to produce marijuana or designate another person under ORS
13 475B.810 to produce marijuana.

14 “(3)(a) The authority shall issue a registry identification card to an ap-
15 plicant who is under 18 years of age if:

16 “(A) The applicant pays the fee and submits the application described in
17 subsection (2) of this section; and

18 “(B) The custodial parent or legal guardian who is responsible for the
19 health care decisions of the applicant signs and submits to the authority a
20 written statement that:

21 “(i) The applicant’s attending [*physician*] **provider** has explained to the
22 applicant and to the custodial parent or legal guardian the possible risks and
23 benefits of the medical use of marijuana;

24 “(ii) The custodial parent or legal guardian consents to the medical use
25 of marijuana by the applicant;

26 “(iii) The custodial parent or legal guardian agrees to serve as the
27 applicant’s designated primary caregiver; and

28 “(iv) The custodial parent or legal guardian agrees to control the acqui-
29 sition, dosage and frequency of the medical use of marijuana by the appli-
30 cant.

1 “(b) An applicant who is under 18 years of age may not apply to produce
2 marijuana under subsection [(2)(f)] **(2)(e)** of this section.

3 “(4) The authority shall:

4 “(a) On the date on which the authority receives an application described
5 in subsection (2) of this section, issue a receipt to the applicant verifying
6 that the authority received an application under subsection (2) or (3) of this
7 section; and

8 “(b) Approve or deny an application received under subsection (2) or (3)
9 of this section within 30 days after receiving the application.

10 “(5)(a) If the authority approves an application, the authority shall issue
11 a serially numbered registry identification card to the applicant within five
12 days after approving the application. The registry identification card must
13 include the following information:

14 “(A) The registry identification cardholder’s name, address and date of
15 birth;

16 “(B) The issuance date and expiration date of the registry identification
17 card;

18 “(C) If the registry identification cardholder designated a primary
19 caregiver under ORS 475B.804, the name and address of the registry iden-
20 tification cardholder’s designated primary caregiver; and

21 “(D) Any other information required by the authority by rule.

22 “(b) If the registry identification cardholder designated a primary
23 caregiver under ORS 475B.804, the authority shall issue an identification
24 card to the designated primary caregiver. The identification card must con-
25 tain the information required by paragraph (a) of this subsection.

26 “(6) A registry identification cardholder shall:

27 “(a) In a form and manner prescribed by the authority, notify the au-
28 thority of any change concerning the registry identification cardholder’s:

29 “(A) Name, address or attending [*physician*] **provider**;

30 “(B) Designated primary caregiver, including the designation of a primary

1 caregiver made at a time other than at the time of applying for or renewing
2 a registry identification card; or

3 “(C) Person responsible for a marijuana grow site, including the desig-
4 nation of a person responsible for a marijuana grow site made at a time
5 other than at the time of applying for or renewing a registry identification
6 card.

7 “(b) Annually renew the registry identification card by paying a fee in
8 an amount established by the authority by rule and submitting to the au-
9 thority an application that contains the following information:

10 “(A) Updated written documentation from the registry identification
11 cardholder’s attending [*physician*] **provider** stating that the registry iden-
12 tification cardholder still has a debilitating medical condition and that the
13 medical use of marijuana may mitigate the symptoms or effects of the regis-
14 try identification cardholder’s debilitating medical condition;

15 “(B) The information described in subsection (2)(b) to [(*f*)] (**e**) of this
16 section; and

17 “(C) If the registry identification cardholder is under 18 years of age, a
18 statement signed by the custodial parent or legal guardian of the registry
19 identification cardholder that meets the requirements of subsection (3) of this
20 section.

21 “(7) The authority shall:

22 “(a) On the date on which the authority receives an application described
23 in subsection (2) of this section, issue a receipt to the applicant verifying
24 that the authority received an application under subsection (6)(b) of this
25 section; and

26 “(b) Approve or deny an application received under subsection (6)(b) of
27 this section within 30 days after receiving the application.

28 “(8)(a) If the registry identification cardholder’s attending [*physician*]
29 **provider** determines that the registry identification cardholder no longer has
30 a debilitating medical condition, or determines that the medical use of

1 marijuana is contraindicated for the registry identification cardholder's de-
2 bilitating medical condition, the registry identification cardholder shall re-
3 turn the registry identification card to the authority within 30 calendar days
4 after receiving notice of the determination.

5 “(b) If, because of circumstances beyond the control of the registry iden-
6 tification cardholder, a registry identification cardholder is unable to obtain
7 a second medical opinion about the registry identification cardholder's con-
8 tinuing eligibility for the medical use of marijuana before having to return
9 the registry identification card to the authority, the authority may grant the
10 registry identification cardholder additional time to obtain a second medical
11 opinion.

12 “(9)(a) The authority may deny an application for a registry identification
13 card or an application to renew a registry identification card, or may sus-
14 pend or revoke a registry identification card, if:

15 “(A) The applicant or registry identification cardholder does not provide
16 the information required by this section;

17 “(B) The authority determines that the applicant or registry identification
18 cardholder provided false information; or

19 “(C) The authority determines that the applicant or registry identification
20 cardholder violated a provision of ORS 475B.785 to 475B.949 or a rule
21 adopted under ORS 475B.785 to 475B.949.

22 “(b) If a registry identification card is revoked, any associated identifi-
23 cation card issued under subsection (5)(b) of this section, or marijuana grow
24 site registration card issued under ORS 475B.810 [(6)] (5), shall also be re-
25 voked.

26 “(c) A person whose application is denied, or whose registry identification
27 card is revoked, under this subsection may not reapply for a registry iden-
28 tification card for six months from the date of the denial or revocation un-
29 less otherwise authorized by the authority.

30 “(10)(a) The authority may deny a designation of a primary caregiver

1 made under ORS 475B.804, or suspend or revoke an associated identification
2 card issued under subsection (5)(b) of this section, if the authority determines
3 that the designee or the registry identification cardholder violated a pro-
4 vision of ORS 475B.785 to 475B.949 or a rule adopted under ORS 475B.785 to
5 475B.949.

6 “(b) A person whose designation has been denied, or whose identification
7 card has been revoked, under this subsection may not be designated as a
8 primary caregiver under ORS 475B.804 for six months from the date of the
9 denial or revocation unless otherwise authorized by the authority.

10 “(11)(a) Notwithstanding subsection (2) or (6)(b) of this section, if an ap-
11 plicant for a registry identification card, or a registry identification
12 cardholder applying for renewal of a registry identification card, submits to
13 the authority [*proof of having served in the Armed Forces of the United*
14 *States*] **applicable documentation listed in paragraph (c) of this sub-**
15 **section**, the authority may not impose a fee that is greater than \$20 for the
16 issuance or renewal of the registry identification card.

17 “(b) Notwithstanding subsection (6)(b)(A) of this section, the requirement
18 that a registry identification cardholder include in the application to renew
19 a registry identification card updated written documentation from the
20 cardholder’s attending [*physician*] **provider** regarding the cardholder’s con-
21 tinuing debilitating medical condition does not apply to a service-disabled
22 veteran who:

23 “(A) Has been assigned a total and permanent disability rating for com-
24 pensation that rates the veteran as unable to secure or follow a substantially
25 gainful occupation as a result of service-connected disabilities as described
26 in 38 C.F.R. 4.16; or

27 “(B) Has a United States Department of Veterans Affairs total disability
28 rating of 100 percent as a result of an injury or illness that the veteran in-
29 curred, or that was aggravated, during active military service and who re-
30 ceived a discharge or release under other than dishonorable conditions.

1 “(c) The following are acceptable documentation for the purposes
2 of paragraph (a) of this subsection:

3 “(A) Proof of having served in the Armed Forces of the United
4 States;

5 “(B) Proof of receiving Supplemental Security Income; or

6 “(C) Proof of receiving Social Security Disability Insurance benefits.

7 “(12) For any purpose described in ORS 475B.785 to 475B.949, including
8 exemption from criminal liability under ORS 475B.907, a receipt issued by the
9 authority verifying that an application has been submitted to the authority
10 under subsection (2), (3) or (6)(b) of this section has the same legal effect as
11 a registry identification card for 30 days following the date on which the
12 receipt was issued to the applicant.

13 “**SECTION 8.** ORS 475B.797, as amended by section 7 of this 2021 Act,
14 is amended to read:

15 “475B.797. (1) The Oregon Health Authority shall establish a program for
16 the issuance of registry identification cards to applicants who meet the re-
17 quirements of this section.

18 “(2) The authority shall issue a registry identification card to an appli-
19 cant who is 18 years of age or older if the applicant pays a fee in an amount
20 established by the authority by rule and submits to the authority an appli-
21 cation containing the following information:

22 “(a) Written documentation from the applicant’s attending provider stat-
23 ing that the attending provider has diagnosed the applicant as having a de-
24 bilitating medical condition and that the medical use of marijuana may
25 mitigate the symptoms or effects of the applicant’s debilitating medical con-
26 dition;

27 “(b) The name, address and date of birth of the applicant;

28 “(c) The name, address and telephone number of the applicant’s attending
29 provider;

30 “(d) The name and address of the applicant’s designated primary

1 caregiver, if the applicant is designating a primary caregiver under ORS
2 475B.804; and

3 “(e) The information described in ORS 475B.810 (2), if the applicant is
4 applying to produce marijuana or designate another person under ORS
5 475B.810 to produce marijuana.

6 “(3)(a) The authority shall issue a registry identification card to an ap-
7 plicant who is under 18 years of age if:

8 “(A) The applicant pays the fee and submits the application described in
9 subsection (2) of this section; and

10 “(B) The custodial parent or legal guardian who is responsible for the
11 health care decisions of the applicant signs and submits to the authority a
12 written statement that:

13 “(i) The applicant’s attending provider has explained to the applicant and
14 to the custodial parent or legal guardian the possible risks and benefits of
15 the medical use of marijuana;

16 “(ii) The custodial parent or legal guardian consents to the medical use
17 of marijuana by the applicant;

18 “(iii) The custodial parent or legal guardian agrees to serve as the
19 applicant’s designated primary caregiver; and

20 “(iv) The custodial parent or legal guardian agrees to control the acqui-
21 sition, dosage and frequency of the medical use of marijuana by the appli-
22 cant.

23 “(b) An applicant who is under 18 years of age may not apply to produce
24 marijuana under subsection (2)(e) of this section.

25 “(4) The authority shall:

26 “(a) On the date on which the authority receives an application described
27 in subsection (2) of this section, issue a receipt to the applicant verifying
28 that the authority received an application under subsection (2) or (3) of this
29 section; and

30 “(b) Approve or deny an application received under subsection (2) or (3)

1 of this section within 30 days after receiving the application.

2 “(5)(a) If the authority approves an application, the authority shall issue
3 a serially numbered registry identification card to the applicant within five
4 days after approving the application. The registry identification card must
5 include the following information:

6 “(A) The registry identification cardholder’s name, address and date of
7 birth;

8 “(B) The issuance date and expiration date of the registry identification
9 card;

10 “(C) If the registry identification cardholder designated a primary
11 caregiver under ORS 475B.804, the name and address of the registry iden-
12 tification cardholder’s designated primary caregiver; and

13 “(D) Any other information required by the authority by rule.

14 “(b) If the registry identification cardholder designated a primary
15 caregiver under ORS 475B.804, the authority shall issue an identification
16 card to the designated primary caregiver. The identification card must con-
17 tain the information required by paragraph (a) of this subsection.

18 **“(c) If an applicant under subsection (2) of this section provides**
19 **written documentation from the applicant’s attending provider that**
20 **the attending provider has diagnosed the applicant as having a debili-**
21 **tating medical condition of which the applicant cannot be cured and**
22 **the authority approves the applicant’s application, the authority shall**
23 **issue to the applicant a permanent registry identification card that**
24 **contains the information described in paragraph (a)(A), (C) and (D)**
25 **of this subsection and that is not subject to the renewal requirements**
26 **under subsection (6)(b) of this section.**

27 “(6) A registry identification cardholder shall:

28 “(a) In a form and manner prescribed by the authority, notify the au-
29 thority of any change concerning the registry identification cardholder’s:

30 “(A) Name, address or attending provider;

1 “(B) Designated primary caregiver, including the designation of a primary
2 caregiver made at a time other than at the time of applying for or renewing
3 a registry identification card; or

4 “(C) Person responsible for a marijuana grow site, including the desig-
5 nation of a person responsible for a marijuana grow site made at a time
6 other than at the time of applying for or renewing a registry identification
7 card.

8 “(b) **Except as provided in subsection (5)(c) of this section**, annually
9 renew the registry identification card by paying a fee in an amount estab-
10 lished by the authority by rule and submitting to the authority an applica-
11 tion that contains the following information:

12 “(A) Updated written documentation from the registry identification
13 cardholder’s attending provider stating that the registry identification
14 cardholder still has a debilitating medical condition and that the medical use
15 of marijuana may mitigate the symptoms or effects of the registry identifi-
16 cation cardholder’s debilitating medical condition;

19 “(C) If the registry identification cardholder is under 18 years of age, a

24 vention, early intervention and treatment;

25 “(C) [*Fifteen*] **Fourteen** percent of the moneys in the account must be
26 used solely for purposes for which moneys in the State Police Account es-
27 tablished under ORS 181A.020 may be used; [*and*]

28 “(D) [*Five*] **Four** percent of the moneys in the account must be used solely
29 for purposes related to alcohol and drug abuse prevention, early intervention
30 and treatment services[.]; **and**

1 **“(E) Four percent of the moneys in the account must be used solely**
2 **for the purposes of administering ORS 475B.785 to 475B.949.**

3 “(4)(a) A city that has an ordinance prohibiting the establishment of a
4 premises for which issuance of a license under ORS 475B.070, 475B.090,
5 475B.100 or 475B.105 is required is not eligible to receive transfers of moneys
6 under subsection [(3)(b)(A)] **(3)(c)(A)** of this section.

7 “(b) A county that has an ordinance prohibiting the establishment of a
8 premises for which issuance of a license under ORS 475B.070 is required is
9 not eligible to receive transfers of moneys under subsection [(3)(b)(B)(i)]
10 **(3)(c)(B)(i)** of this section.

11 “(c) A county that has an ordinance prohibiting the establishment of a
12 premises for which issuance of a license under ORS 475B.090, 475B.100 or
13 475B.105 is required is not eligible to receive transfers of moneys under
14 subsection [(3)(b)(B)(ii)] **(3)(c)(B)(ii)** of this section.

15 “(5)(a) A city or county that is ineligible under subsection (4) of this
16 section to receive a transfer of moneys from the Oregon Marijuana Account
17 during a given quarter but has received a transfer of moneys for that quarter
18 shall return the amount transferred to the Department of Revenue, with in-
19 terest as described under paragraph (f) of this subsection. An ineligible city
20 or county may voluntarily transfer the moneys to the Department of Revenue
21 immediately upon receipt of the ineligible transfer.

22 “(b) If the Director of the Oregon Department of Administrative Services
23 determines that a city or county received a transfer of moneys under sub-
24 section [(3)(b)] **(3)(c)** of this section but was ineligible to receive that
25 transfer under subsection (4) of this section, the director shall provide notice
26 to the ineligible city or county and order the city or county to return the
27 amount received to the Department of Revenue, with interest as described
28 under paragraph (f) of this subsection. A city or county may appeal the order
29 within 30 days of the date of the order under the procedures for a contested
30 case under ORS chapter 183.

1 “(c) As soon as the order under paragraph (b) of this subsection becomes
2 final, the director shall notify the Department of Revenue and the ineligible
3 city or county. Upon notification, the Department of Revenue immediately
4 shall proceed to collect the amount stated in the notice.

5 “(d) The Department of Revenue shall have the benefit of all laws of the
6 state pertaining to the collection of income and excise taxes and may proceed
7 to collect the amounts described in the notice under paragraph (c) of this
8 subsection. An assessment of tax is not necessary and the collection de-
9 scribed in this subsection is not precluded by any statute of limitations.

10 “(e) If a city or county is subject to an order to return moneys from an
11 ineligible transfer, the city or county shall be denied any further relief in
12 connection with the ineligible transfer on or after the date that the order
13 becomes final.

14 “(f) Interest under this section shall accrue at the rate established in ORS
15 305.220 beginning on the date the ineligible transfer was made.

16 “(g) Both the moneys and the interest collected from or returned by an
17 ineligible city or county shall be redistributed to the cities or counties that
18 were eligible to receive a transfer under subsection [(3)(b)] **(3)(c)** of this
19 section on the date the ineligible transfer was made.

20 “(6)(a) Not later than July 1 of each year, each city and county in this
21 state shall certify with the Oregon Department of Administrative Services
22 whether the city or county has an ordinance prohibiting the establishment
23 of a premises for which issuance of a license under ORS 475B.070, 475B.090,
24 475B.100 or 475B.105 is required. The certification shall be made concurrently
25 with the certifications under ORS 221.770, in a form and manner prescribed
26 by the Oregon Department of Administrative Services.

27 “(b) If a city fails to comply with this subsection, the city is not eligible
28 to receive transfers of moneys under subsection [(3)(b)(A)] **(3)(c)(A)** of this
29 section. If a county fails to comply with this subsection, the county is not
30 eligible to receive transfers of moneys under subsection [(3)(b)(B)] **(3)(c)(B)**

1 of this section.

2 “(c) A city or county that repeals an ordinance as provided in ORS
3 475B.496 shall file an updated certification with the Oregon Department of
4 Administrative Services in a form and manner prescribed by the department,
5 noting the effective date of the change. A city or county that repeals an or-
6 dinance as provided in ORS 475B.496 is eligible to receive quarterly transfers
7 of moneys under this section for quarters where the repeal is effective for
8 the entire quarter and the updated certification was filed at least 30 days
9 before the date of transfer.

10 “[*(7) Before making the transfer of moneys required by subsection (3) of this*
11 *section, the department shall transfer quarterly to the Drug Treatment and*
12 *Recovery Services Fund all moneys in the Oregon Marijuana Account in excess*
13 *of \$11,250,000.*]

14 “**SECTION 49.** Section 5, chapter 2, Oregon Laws 2021 (Ballot Measure
15 110 (2020)), is amended to read:

16 “**Sec. 5.** (1) The Drug Treatment and Recovery Services Fund is estab-
17 lished in the State Treasury, separate and distinct from the General Fund.
18 Interest earned by the **Drug Treatment and Recovery Services** Fund shall
19 be credited to the fund.

20 “(2) The Drug Treatment and Recovery Services Fund shall consist of:

21 “(a) Moneys deposited into the fund pursuant to section 6, **chapter 2,**
22 **Oregon Laws 2021 (Ballot Measure 110 (2020));**

23 “(b) Moneys appropriated or otherwise transferred to the fund by the
24 Legislative Assembly;

25 “(c) Moneys allocated from the Oregon Marijuana Account, pursuant to
26 ORS 475B.759 [(7)] **(3)(b)**; and[,]

27 “(d) All other moneys deposited [*in*] **into** the fund from any source.

28 “(3) Moneys in the fund shall be continuously appropriated to the Oregon
29 Health Authority for the purposes set forth in section 2, **chapter 2, Oregon**
30 **Laws 2021 (Ballot Measure 110 (2020)).**

1 “[4] *Unexpended moneys in the fund may not lapse and shall be carried*
2 *forward and may be used without regard to fiscal year or biennium.*]

3 “[5(a)] **(4)(a)** Pursuant to subsection (2)(b) of this section, the Legisla-
4 tive Assembly shall appropriate or transfer to the fund an amount sufficient
5 to fully fund the grants program required by section 2, **chapter 2, Oregon**
6 **Laws 2021 (Ballot Measure 110 (2020))**.

7 “(b) The total amount deposited and transferred into the fund shall not
8 be less than \$57 million for the first year [*this Act*] **chapter 2, Oregon Laws**
9 **2021 (Ballot Measure 110 (2020))**, is in effect.

10 “(c) In each subsequent year, [*that*] **the minimum transfer** amount set
11 forth in **paragraph (b) of this** subsection [(5)(b) of this section] shall be in-
12 creased by not less than **the sum of:**

13 “[i)] **(A) \$57 million multiplied by** the percentage [*if any*], **if any**, by
14 which the monthly averaged U.S. City Average Consumer Price Index for the
15 12 consecutive months ending [*December*] **August 31** of the prior calendar
16 year exceeds the monthly index for the fourth quarter of the calendar year
17 2020; and[,]

18 “[ii)] **(B) [An amount not less than the increase] The annual increase,**
19 **if any**, in moneys distributed pursuant to ORS 475B.759 [(7)] **(3)(b)**.

20 “**SECTION 50. (1) The amendments to ORS 475B.020, 475B.220,**
21 **475B.531, 475B.570, 475B.630, 475B.707 and 475B.759 and section 5, chap-**
22 **ter 2, Oregon Laws 2021 (Ballot Measure 110 (2020))**, by sections 42 to
23 **49 of this 2021 Act become operative on January 1, 2022.**

24 “**(2) The Department of Revenue and the Oregon Liquor Control**
25 **Commission may take any action before the operative date specified**
26 **in subsection (1) of this section that is necessary to enable the de-**
27 **partment and commission to exercise, on and after the operative date**
28 **specified in subsection (1) of this section, all of the duties, functions**
29 **and powers conferred on the department and the commission by the**
30 **amendments to ORS 475B.020, 475B.220, 475B.531, 475B.570, 475B.630,**

1 **475B.707 and 475B.759 and section 5, chapter 2, Oregon Laws 2021 (Bal-**
2 **lot Measure 110 (2020)), by sections 42 to 49 of this 2021 Act.**
