

Requested by Senator GORSEK

**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
SENATE BILL 414**

1 In line 2 of the printed bill, after “livability” insert “; and declaring an
2 emergency”.

3 Delete lines 4 through 10 and insert:

4 **“SECTION 1. (1)(a) The governing body of Multnomah County shall**
5 **create a program through which the county awards grants to individ-**
6 **uals and neighborhood associations for the purpose of sponsoring local**
7 **community cleanup projects.**

8 **“(b) The cleanup projects may include picking up garbage with the**
9 **use of a dumpster, removal or overpainting of graffiti and any similar**
10 **activity that restores land and improvements located in the grant**
11 **recipient’s community.**

12 **“(c) To the extent feasible, a grant recipient shall employ applicable**
13 **principles of crime prevention through environmental design in**
14 **cleanup projects funded with grant moneys under this section.**

15 **“(2) A grant may not be made in an amount greater than \$5,000 per**
16 **award.**

17 **“(3)(a) The governing body of the county shall adopt an application**
18 **process and notify the public of the process adopted, including appli-**
19 **cation submission deadlines and a description of the kinds of cleanup**
20 **projects for which grants may be awarded.**

21 **“(b) The county shall notify each applicant of the county’s decision**

1 to approve or reject an application.

2 “(c) Before disbursing grant award moneys for an approved appli-
3 cation, the county and the applicant must agree to a reasonable time
4 for completion of the cleanup project and any other measures of suc-
5 cess the county considers important.

6 “(d) The county is not required to allow appeals of rejected appli-
7 cations but may consult with such applicants and allow for reapplica-
8 tion at any time.

9 “(e) The county shall notify the public of grant awards, including,
10 but not limited to, the recipient of the grant, the cleanup project for
11 which the grant was awarded, the community in which the cleanup
12 project will be conducted, the length of time the cleanup project will
13 require, any disruptions the cleanup project may cause and any other
14 information the county considers important for the public to know.

15 “(4)(a) The county shall require each grant recipient, after the
16 cleanup project funded with grant moneys has been completed, to
17 submit a report to the county that demonstrates to the satisfaction
18 of the county that the cleanup project was conducted and completed
19 in substantial compliance with the proposal included in the application
20 for the grant and the terms agreed to under subsection (3)(c) of this
21 section.

22 “(b) A grant recipient may apply for another grant only if the
23 county is satisfied with the grant recipient’s report submitted under
24 paragraph (a) of this subsection.

25 “(c) A grant recipient that does not conduct or complete a cleanup
26 project within a reasonable time or to the satisfaction of the county,
27 or that does not submit a report as required under this paragraph, is
28 not eligible for any further grant awards.

29 “(d) The report shall be accompanied by a survey of each grant re-
30 cipient conducted by the county before and after the grant recipient

1 completes the cleanup project to determine how the grant recipient
2 believes the cleanup project improved the community in which it was
3 conducted.

4 “(5) The governing body of the county may retain an amount from
5 the moneys distributed to the county under section 2 of this 2021 Act
6 to reimburse the county for the actual costs of administering the
7 grant program.

8 “(6) Not later than September 15, 2022, the governing body of the
9 county shall submit a report, in the manner provided under ORS
10 192.245, to the interim committees of the Legislative Assembly related
11 to community livability that describes the experience of the county
12 grant program created under this section. The report may include
13 recommendations for legislation, including legislation to expand the
14 grant program.

15 “SECTION 2. There is appropriated to the Oregon Business Devel-
16 opment Department, for the biennium beginning July 1, 2021, out of
17 the General Fund, the amount of \$100,000 for distribution to the gov-
18 erning body of Multnomah County for carrying out the purposes of
19 section 1 of this 2021 Act.

20 “SECTION 3. Section 1 of this 2021 Act is repealed on January 2,
21 2024.

22 “SECTION 4. This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate
23 preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
24 declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect on its passage.”.

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
