PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO A-ENGROSSED SENATE BILL 554

1 On <u>page 1</u> of the printed A-engrossed bill, line 2, after "firearms" delete 2 the rest of the line and insert a period.

3 Delete line 3 and insert:

Whereas statistical data from the National Safety Council and the National Center for Health Statistics indicate that firearms are involved in 1.5 percent of accidental fatalities nationwide, far behind deaths due to motor vehicle accidents (47 percent), falls (15 percent), poisonings (10 percent), drownings (four percent), fires (three percent), suffocation on ingested objects (three percent) and other causes; and

Whereas the syllabus of the opinion of the Supreme Court of the United States in the case District of Columbia v. Heller states 'The handgun ban and the trigger-lock requirement (as applied to self-defense) violate the Second Amendment'; and

"Whereas the syllabus of the opinion of the Supreme Court of the United States in the case District of Columbia v. Heller states 'Similarly, the requirement that any lawful firearm in the home be dissembled or bound by a trigger lock makes it impossible for citizens to use arms for the core lawful purpose of self-defense and is hence unconstitutional'; now, therefore,".

19 Delete lines 5 through 19 and delete pages 2 through 9 and insert:

20 "SECTION 1. (1) The Department of Education shall by rule develop 21 a firearm safety education curriculum for students in grades 7 through 1 **9.**

"(2) Each school district shall ensure that students in grades 7
through 9 receive instruction in accordance with the firearm safety
education curriculum described in subsection (1) of this section.

5 "(3) The department or a school district may contract with an out-6 side entity to develop the curriculum or provide the instruction de-7 scribed in this section.

8 "<u>SECTION 2.</u> Notwithstanding any other law, a person who lawfully 9 owns a firearm and stores the firearm inside the person's home is 10 safely and lawfully storing the firearm.

"SECTION 3. Notwithstanding any other law, a person who lawfully owns a firearm and stores the firearm inside the person's motor vehicle, in accordance with ORS 166.250 and while the person is inside the vehicle, is safely and lawfully storing the firearm.".
