## PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL 250

- Delete lines 4 through 26 of the printed bill and insert:
- **"SECTION 1.** ORS 205.242 is amended to read:
- "205.242. (1) [Except as provided in subsection (2) of this section, in every
- 4 county,] The office of the county clerk in every county shall establish
- 5 **regular business hours to** receive and certify, as required [by] **under** ORS
- 6 93.620, instruments presented for recording, for a minimum of [six hours be-
- 7 tween the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m., including the first hour and the last
- 8 hour, on every day except Saturdays, Sundays and other holidays] four hours
- 9 per day, and 30 hours per week, from Monday through Friday.
- "(2) Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section:
- 11 "(a) The county clerk may reduce the number of regular business
- 12 hours below the minimums required under subsection (1) of this sec-
- 13 tion for:
- "(A) A holiday recognized by the county governing body;
- 15 "(B) A state of emergency declared at the local, state or federal
- 16 **level**; or
- "(C) An event that poses a safety risk to the public or staff of the
- 18 **office.**
- 19 "(b) The county clerk may reduce the number of regular weekly
- 20 business hours to less than 30 for training programs of the office of
- 21 the county clerk, not to exceed two business day closures per year.

"[(2)](3)(a) [The provisions of this section may be modified for a fiscal year by] Notwithstanding subsection (1) of this section, the county governing body may modify the regular business hours of the office of the county clerk for a fiscal year upon adoption of a resolution in which [it] the governing body determines in its sole discretion that a fiscal emergency exists in the county.

"(b) A resolution adopted under this subsection may be renewed, amended or repealed by the county governing body.

"(c) [Hours of recording shall] The regular business hours established under subsection (1) of this section may not be reduced under [the] a resolution to [any] a greater extent [greater] than the [reductions for] regular business hours of other nonemergency county services housed within the same building are reduced."

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
