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PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL 2630

1	After line 3 of the printed bill, insert:
2	"Whereas wildfires raged through several Oregon communities in 2020
3	causing devastation to the communities and to families and public schools
4	in the communities; and
5	"Whereas many of these wildfire-impacted communities are overrepre-
6	sented by populations historically marginalized because of poverty, housing
7	insecurity, race or ethnicity; and
8	"Whereas as many as 80 percent of students in some wildfire-impacted
9	school districts lost their permanent housing and all of their belongings; and
10	"Whereas the families in these wildfire-impacted communities lost power,
11	Internet access, television service and telephone service; and
12	"Whereas many families of students who are residents of wildfire-
13	impacted school districts had to relocate to stable housing outside of the
14	school district in the aftermath of this tragedy; and
15	"Whereas the schools of these wildfire-impacted areas are the hearts of
16	the communities and are critical to their efforts to rebuild; and
17	"Whereas Oregon's commitment to its most vulnerable students has been
18	matched with renewed commitment to educational funding through the Stu-
19	dent Success Act; and

"Whereas school districts severely impacted by the devastation of the 2020

wildfires in the midst of the global COVID-19 pandemic have a uniquely ur-

- 1 gent need to have stable funding over five years to enable them to fully re-
- 2 cover; now, therefore,".

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- 3 Delete lines 5 through 29 and insert:
- "SECTION 1. Sections 2 and 4 of this 2021 Act are added to and made a part of ORS chapter 327.
- "SECTION 2. (1) As used in this section, 'ADMw' means the weighted average daily membership of a school district, as calculated under ORS 327.013, minus any ADMw attributable to a virtual public charter school, as defined in ORS 338.005.
- "(2) In addition to distributing moneys through the State School
 Fund and the Student Investment Account, the Department of Education shall award grants to wildfire-impacted school districts as provided by this section.
- 14 "(3) A school district may apply for a grant under this section if:
 - "(a) The average daily membership of the school district, as compared to the average daily membership of the school district for the 2019-2020 school year, decreased for any school year occurring after the 2019-2020 school year; and
 - "(b) The school district can demonstrate that one or more of the following occurred:
- "(A) One or more school buildings of the school district were damaged as the result of wildfires and that damage resulted in students being displaced from the building or the building being closed to students;
- "(B) The cause of the decrease in average daily membership was the result of damage to students' permanent homes and the relocation of students to housing outside of the school district; or
- "(C) Any other circumstances identified by the State Board of Education by rule as being directly related to the wildfires and causing a decrease in the average daily membership.

- "(4) The amount of a grant awarded under this section shall equal the sum of:
- "(a) The difference between the following, in relation to distributions from the State School Fund under ORS 327.013:
- "(A) The amount distributed to the school district from the State School Fund under ORS 327.013, as calculated based on a district extended ADMw that equals the district ADMw for the 2019-2020 school year; and
- "(B) The amount distributed to the school district from the State School Fund under ORS 327.013, as calculated based on a district extended ADMw that equals the district ADMw for the current school year; and
 - "(b) The difference between the following, in relation to distributions from the Student Investment Account under ORS 327.195:
 - "(A) The amount distributed to the school district from the Student Investment Account under ORS 327.195, as calculated based on a district extended ADMw that equals the district ADMw for the 2019-2020 school year; and
 - "(B) The amount distributed to the school district from the Student Investment Account under ORS 327.195, as calculated based on a district extended ADMw that equals the district ADMw for the current school year.
 - "(5) Notwithstanding ORS 327.013 and 327.195, if a school district receives a grant under this section, the district extended ADMw of the school district for purposes of calculating State School Fund distributions under ORS 327.013 and Student Investment Account distributions under ORS 327.195 shall equal the ADMw of the current school year.
- 29 "(6) A school district may qualify for a grant under this section only 30 for school years in which the average daily membership of the school

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- district for the current school year is less than the average daily membership of the school district for the 2019-2020 school year.
- "(7) The department shall award grants under this section from moneys available in the School Stabilization Account for Wildfireimpacted School Districts established under section 4 of this 2021 Act.
- 6 "(8) The State Board of Education shall adopt any rules necessary 7 for the administration of this section.
- "SECTION 3. Section 2 of this 2021 Act applies to State School Fund distributions made for the 2021-2022, 2022-2023, 2023-2024 and 2023-2025 school years.
- "SECTION 4. (1) The School Stabilization Account for Wildfireimpacted School Districts is established in the State Treasury, separate and distinct from the General Fund.
 - "(2) Interest earned on the School Stabilization Account for Wildfire-impacted School Districts shall be credited to the account.
- "(3) The School Stabilization Account for Wildfire-impacted School
 Districts shall consist of moneys transferred to the account from the
 School Stabilization Fund established by chapter ____, Oregon Laws 2021
 (Enrolled House Bill 3127).
- "(4) Moneys in the School Stabilization Account for Wildfireimpacted School Districts are continuously appropriated to the Department of Education for the purpose described in section 2 of this 23 2021 Act.
- - "SECTION 6. Sections 2 and 4 of this 2021 Act are repealed on July

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1 **1, 2025.**

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- "SECTION 7. (1) On July 1, 2025, the School Stabilization Account for Wildfire-impacted School Districts established by section 4 of this 2021 Act is abolished.
- "(2) Any moneys remaining in the School Stabilization Account for
 Wildfire-impacted School Districts on July 1, 2025, shall be transferred
 to the General Fund for general governmental purposes.
- "SECTION 8. If House Bill 3127 (2021) does not become law or does
 not establish the School Stabilization Fund, sections 1 to 7 of this 2021
 Act are repealed.
 - "SECTION 9. This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect July 1, 2021."
