Notwithstanding any other law limiting expenditures, 6 the amount of \$27,715,133 is established for the biennium beginning 7 July 1, 2021, as the maximum limit for payment of expenses by the 8 Oregon Department of Administrative Services from lottery moneys 9 allocated from the Administrative Services Economic Development 10 Fund for debt service and related costs for bonds issued in previous 11 biennia.

 and paying claims for coverage pursuant to statutory authority.

1 payments described in ORS 291.407 to mass transit districts, transpor-

2 tation districts and service districts.

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<u>SECTION 7.</u> This 2021 Act being necessary for the immediate
preservation of the public peace, health and safety, an emergency is
declared to exist, and this 2021 Act takes effect July 1, 2021.".
