**PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO
B-ENGROSSED SENATE BILL 225**

1 On page 1 of the printed B-engrossed bill, line 2, after “327.254” insert
2 “and sections 1 and 2, chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2014”.

3 On page 3, after line 5, insert:

4 **“SECTION 3.** Section 1, chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2014, as amended by
5 section 6, chapter 74, Oregon Laws 2016, and section 1, chapter 685, Oregon
6 Laws 2019, is amended to read:

7 **“Sec. 1.** (1) The Task Force on School Safety is established, consisting
8 of [18] **23** members as follows:

9 “(a) The Superintendent of State Police or the superintendent’s designee.

10 “(b) The Director of the Department of Public Safety Standards and
11 Training or the director’s designee.

12 “(c) The Governor’s Public Safety Policy Advisor.

13 “(d) The Governor’s Education Policy Advisor.

14 “(e) The President of the Senate shall appoint one member from among
15 members of the Senate.

16 “(f) The Speaker of the House of Representatives shall appoint one mem-
17 ber from among members of the House of Representatives.

18 “(g) The Governor shall appoint [12] **17** members as follows:

19 “(A) A member of the Oregon State Sheriffs’ Association;

20 “(B) A member of the Oregon Association Chiefs of Police;

21 “(C) A member of the Oregon Fire Chiefs Association;

1 “(D) A member of the Oregon Education Association;
2 “(E) A member of the Oregon School Employees Association;
3 “(F) A member of the Oregon School Boards Association;
4 “(G) A member of the Oregon Association of Education Service Districts;
5 “(H) A member of the [*Confederation*] **Coalition** of Oregon School Ad-
6 ministrators;
7 “(I) A member representing the Department of Education;
8 “(J) A member of the Association of Oregon Community Mental Health
9 Programs;
10 “(K) A member of the Oregon Health Authority; [*and*]
11 “(L) A member of the Office of Emergency Management[.]; **and**
12 “(M) **Five members who represent historically, traditionally and**
13 **currently disadvantaged or underrepresented groups.**
14 “(2) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task force are
15 nonvoting members of the task force and may act in an advisory capacity
16 only.
17 “(3) The task force shall:
18 “[*(a)(A) Develop a request for proposals to be published by the Department*
19 *of State Police for hiring a vendor to create a database of floor plans for all*
20 *schools within the state, accessible to authorized users via the Internet; and*]
21 “[*(B) Make recommendations to the Department of State Police for the de-*
22 *velopment of administrative rules governing the database, including but not*
23 *limited to:*]
24 “[*(i) Specifying the persons and agencies that may have access to the data-*
25 *base;*]
26 “[*(ii) Identifying the persons or agencies that will maintain the database;*
27 *and*]
28 “[*(iii) Regulating the manner in which database records are added or*
29 *modified;*]
30 “[*(b) Examine models of existing education and training programs for law*

1 *enforcement officials, other first responders and school employees in the area*
2 *of school safety and incident response; and]*

3 *“(c) Examine models for existing protocols for school safety and incident*
4 *response and consider whether standardized statewide school safety and inci-*
5 *dent response protocols would be appropriate.]*

6 **“(a) Examine existing and emerging issues related to school safety**
7 **using an all-hazards and equity-driven approach that is responsive to**
8 **current safety needs;**

9 **“(b) Examine existing and emerging models of education and**
10 **training programs for law enforcement officials, other first responders**
11 **and school employees in the areas of school safety, security and**
12 **emergency management; and**

13 **“(c) Examine existing and emerging models for protocols for school**
14 **safety, security and emergency management and consider to what ex-**
15 **tent standardizing protocols would be appropriate.**

16 *“(4) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a*
17 *quorum for the transaction of business.*

18 *“(5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority*
19 *of the voting members of the task force.*

20 *“(6) The task force shall elect one of its members to serve as chairperson*
21 *and one of its members to serve as vice chairperson.*

22 *“(7) If there is a vacancy for any cause, the appointing authority shall*
23 *make an appointment to become immediately effective.*

24 *“(8) The task force shall meet at times and places specified by the call*
25 *of the chairperson or of a majority of the voting members of the task force.*
26 **To the extent possible the task force shall meet by telephone or video**
27 **conference but may meet in person.**

28 *“(9) The task force may adopt rules necessary for the operation of the*
29 *task force.*

30 *“(10) The task force shall submit a report concerning the floor plan data-*

1 *base in the manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommen-*
2 *dations for legislation, to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly*
3 *related to the judiciary as appropriate no later than September 1, 2017. A*
4 *second report shall be submitted in a similar manner no later than September*
5 *1, 2019. A third report shall be submitted in a similar manner no later than*
6 *September 1, 2021.]*

7 **“(10) The task force shall submit annually by December 1 a report**
8 **regarding its findings made under subsection (3) of this section in the**
9 **manner provided by ORS 192.245, and may include recommendations**
10 **as appropriate, to an interim committee of the Legislative Assembly**
11 **related to the judiciary.**

12 **“(11) [*The Department of State Police*] A state agency that has a**
13 **member on the task force shall provide staff support to the task force.**

14 **“(12) Members of the task force who are not employees of a state**
15 **agency or** members of the Legislative Assembly are not entitled to compen-
16 sation, but may be reimbursed for actual and necessary travel and other ex-
17 penses incurred by them in the performance of their official duties in the
18 manner and amounts provided for in ORS 292.495. Claims for expenses in-
19 curred in performing functions of the task force shall be paid out of funds
20 appropriated to the Department of State Police for purposes of the task force.

21 **“(13) All agencies of state government, as defined in ORS 174.111, are di-**
22 **rected to assist the task force in the performance of its duties and, to the**
23 **extent permitted by laws relating to confidentiality, to furnish such infor-**
24 **mation and advice as the members of the task force consider necessary to**
25 **perform their duties.**

26 **“SECTION 4. Section 2, chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2014, as amended by**
27 **section 7, chapter 74, Oregon Laws 2016, and section 2, chapter 685, Oregon**
28 **Laws 2019, is amended to read:**

29 **“Sec. 2. Section 1, chapter 93, Oregon Laws 2014, is repealed on December**
30 **31, [2021] 2023.”**

1 In line 6, delete “3” and insert “5”.

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
