- "(L) A member of the Office of Emergency Management[.]; and 11
- "(M) Five members who represent historically, traditionally and 12 currently disadvantaged or underrepresented groups. 13
- "(2) Members of the Legislative Assembly appointed to the task force are 14 nonvoting members of the task force and may act in an advisory capacity 15 only. 16

- "[(a)(A) Develop a request for proposals to be published by the Department 18 of State Police for hiring a vendor to create a database of floor plans for all 19 schools within the state, accessible to authorized users via the Internet; and]
- "[(B) Make recommendations to the Department of State Police for the de-21 velopment of administrative rules governing the database, including but not 22 *limited to:*] 23
- "[(i) Specifying the persons and agencies that may have access to the data-24 base;] 25

- "(a) Examine existing and emerging issues related to school safety using an all-hazards and equity-driven approach that is responsive to current safety needs;
 - "(b) Examine existing and emerging models of education and training programs for law enforcement officials, other first responders and school employees in the areas of school safety, security and emergency management; and
 - "(c) Examine existing and emerging models for protocols for school safety, security and emergency management and consider to what extent standardizing protocols would be appropriate.
- 16 "(4) A majority of the voting members of the task force constitutes a 17 quorum for the transaction of business.
- 18 "(5) Official action by the task force requires the approval of a majority 19 of the voting members of the task force.
