The law already covers protections for children and in the best interest of the child. The law provides for professional help in making a parenting plan. There's a reason why we don't let 14-year-olds enter into contracts, marry, drive, and vote -- at least for now. And one wonders what problem is being solved by this legislation. What happens if the kid refuses to sign on to any plan that doesn't include a monthly \$500 allowance?
