I am a small landlord. I own a small number of duplexes in Woodburn, OR. I urge you to vote no on this bill. My experience has been that there has been overwhelming support from both the government, and private non-profits to help people in need with rent payments. People are not and will not lose their home if they are suffering the impacts of Covid 19. This bill broadly applies protections to tenants that are not in need, and puts the financial burden of the pandemic squarely on the shoulders of landlords.
