My name is Sarah Evans, my pronouns are she and her, and I live in Salem. I am writing to show my support for SB 704.

I am appalled to know that the "LGBTQ panic defense" even exists, and that, in 2021, we're actually having to talk about creating a bill to ban it. Transgender and non-binary people are just that -- people. I have multiple transgender and non-binary friends, and to think that someone could murder them and then be excused for it just because of my friends' gender identities is horrific. This type of defense sends a message that LGBTQ people are "not human", are of lesser value than straight or cisgender people, or that they are somehow "harming" others with their presence in such a way that "self defense" is needed by the perpetrator.
