Re: SB 395 – Support for required expenditures on footpaths and bicycle trails

Dear Co-Chairs Beyer and McLain, and Members of the Joint Committee on Transportation,

I am writing to express Tigard's support for SB 395 which would increase required expenditures on footpaths and bicycle trails from one percent to five percent of amounts received from the State Highway Fund.

The City of Tigard's strategic plan and vision highlight where we want to go as a community and who we want to be. Our vision, *"An equitable community that is walkable, healthy, and accessible for everyone."* emphasizes the value our community places on equity, walkability, health, and access for all. If passed, SB 395 would directly support the values adopted by the Tigard community by allocating much-needed funding to support active travel.

Allocating a greater share of our limited transportation dollars toward walking and rolling projects is a key step in meeting our collective climate mitigation and adaptation goals. To support residents and employees making different day-to-day travel choices, we must have safe and convenient infrastructure that is accessible to all, but most importantly, to our marginalized and disadvantaged populations.
