

Senate Committee on Housing and Development Testimony in Support of SB282-1 March 5, 2021

Chair Jama, Co-Chair Linthicum, members of the Committee,

On behalf of the Oregon Attorney General's Sexual Assault Task Force, I am pleased to submit testimony in support of SB282-1 to extend the grace period to pay back rent, provide protection to credit and rental records so they can't be used against you, extend protections from landlord retaliation, and allow people to share housing in an emergency.

SATF is a statewide, nonprofit organization whose mission is to improve the response to and prevention of sexual violence in Oregon.

Housing stability is essential to reducing the impacts of sexual violence across our state, as housing insecurity and homelessness increases the risks of perpetration. The increased risk of perpetration, coupled with COVID, will cost us lives and further burden our healthcare, criminal justice, and emergency housing systems.

As we move into the next stage of the COVID pandemic, we must acknowledge the ongoing difficulty that continues to face our most vulnerable communities. We must act to ensure that the fallout from the COVID pandemic does not sentence Oregonians who rent their homes to lasting collateral consequences. We urge you to pass SB 282-1.

Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony, and for all of your hard work to address COVID and the housing crisis across Oregon. We urge your support of SB282-1.
