As one of those who enjoy paddling my canoe for exercise and recreation, it's a harrowing experience to do so on the Willamette River. Surely, we can have rules that allow for the motorboat experience; BUT NOT AT THE EXPENSE OF PADDLES IN CANOES, KAYAKS OR OTHER SELF-PROPELLED WATERCRAFT.

Often these large motor boats (and tows) roar by with little concern to those of us in our canoes. Some do slow down, which is greatly appreciated. With a bit of warning, I turn my canoe to ride their wakes.

Why is it though, the bigger the boat (and tows), the more arrogance and less consideration?

The environmental impact of these huge towed boats and their wakes are harmful to nurseries and habitat.

Today these boats are far too big, and the Marine Board is too limited in its representation (I support HB 2695 as well).
