To the Oregon House Committee On Judiciary:

Street Books is a bicycle-powered mobile library bringing books and reading glasses to people living outside and at the margins of Portland. For the past ten years, we've been privileged to get to know and love many of our library patrons. We know what they like to read (from JK Rowling to Margaret Atwood to Stephen King) and we know about their hopes and their sorrows. We also know that like all humans, they need rest and protection from harm.

We support the passage of HB 2367, as it protects individuals' right to move freely, rest, sleep, pray and be protected in public space without discrimination. The right to rest is a basic human and civil right for all people and should not be considered a crime. Criminalizing people who are experiencing houselessness is not an effective solution to the complications that arise when people in our communities do not have a place to eat, rest or sleep.

The closure of public spaces due to the pandemic means that those living outside are more exposed to the elements than ever. Add to this the number of people on the verge of losing their housing, and it makes sense to focus energy not on criminalizing individuals who have nowhere to go but on expanding affordable housing in the urban areas.
