We spend over 100 hours on the river each year, and I can say from what I have seen is that the vast majority of boaters respect and abide by the guidelines. If there are concerns, I would plead for enforcement of the current guidelines. Please, please do not take away any persons boating rights. It really does have great implications on people's rights and the economy!
