To the members of the Education Committee,

Senate Bill 52 requires that an "education plan" be developed for "lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer, two-spirit, intersex, asexual, nonbinary or another minority gender identity or sexual orientation population."

This is quite an ambitious undertaking considering that each of these orientations, and countless others yet to be discovered or invented, will need their own carefully tailored plans.

While we are working overtime to divide ourselves by race, let's not miss the opportunity to further balkanize the population and create as many separate and competing factions as possible. It's all about unity.

It's particularly timely to be spending vast sums of taxpayer money on this when virtually all schools are closed, students are struggling with the totally failed substitute of "distance learning" and "Oregon My Oregon" (soon to be rewritten) is once again at the very bottom of the heap, educationally speaking.
