Due to COVID, loss of jobs, eviction and the Blue River fire many more people ae on the streets than before. I hear the lament of government that there is not enough money to help the situation, but then I wonder just how much the taxpayers are paying for Public Works cleanup after sweeps, the hours police spend in pursuit of the unhoused, and the court costs when someone is prosecuted. The sweeps are immoral and just might be an unconstitutional violation of personal freedoms. In those sweeps people do not just lose their sleeping bags or tents, but important papers, medications, glasses, etc. How very cruel is that! When considering what to do I think we should all just take a minute, look around at our comfort, and then see ourselves losing all of that through no fault of our own. Thank you.
