On December 13, 2003 I was kidnapped by two men physically restrain put in handcuffs and taken to Albany, Oregon. Eventually ending up in the cascade Mountains for 42 days. Following that trekI was later transported to Bridges boys Academy in Bend, Oregon. I attempted to run away from there three times and on the third time I was apprehended and then transported by another two men to a lockdown facility in Gladstone, Oregon. After completing that program I was then transported by the same two men to Provo Canyon School In Provo, Utah. All this was the result of me having trouble at my high school in Coos Bay, Oregon. I was expelled and going through some issues following the death of my grandma. I ran away from home and I scared my parents. But other than that I was a normal kid, I didn't do drugs, I didn't commit crime, I wasn't violent whatsoever. I got good grades in school I was on the honor roll, I was just a normal kid.

When I returned to Coos Bay In April 2005 I was addicted to drugs I had a horrible problem with authority and I would get into fights. Now I am a 33-year-old felon who is addicted to multiple drugs and criminal activity. All these character defaults stem from my time in the trouble teen industry. I feel that if it was not for the traumatizing way in which these men came and snatched me out of my life I would not have gone through so much pain and turmoil through my life. I suffer from PTSD, see PTSD, hyper vigilance, depression,Anxiety, I have problems with authority, along with trust issues with everyone around me. I have a tendency to hurt the ones that are closest to me and who mean the most to me due to these trust issues and mental health issues.

I feel that these programs and these transport companies rob me of my identity, along with my innocence and childhood in which I will never get back. I feel that all individuals in which I have hurt throughout my life would never of been hurt if I had never been abducted by these men and taken to these facilities. I feel that I would have a relationship with my family if it was not for these men and these facilities. There needs to be a thorough investigation into all for-profit programs throughout Oregon as well as the rest of the country for I am not the only one who has Developed problems from these programs there are many children out there who have Had much worse experiences and who have also been killed. This needs to end.
