TESTIMONY **IN OPPOSITION** OF HB 2785

Chair Witt and Members of the Committee:

My name is Jon Hagen. I am an advocate in Salem.

Oregon DOES NOT NEED more meat processing capacity, which is a climate-change detriment to our ecosystems and planet. The forests are clear cut for grazing, the mistreatment of the animals, and clear trend of declining demand for meat is evident.

I am asking you to vote to OPPOSE <u>HB 2785</u>, which <u>wastes \$10 million dollars</u> of funds to expand and upgrade an archaic industry that is heralded for mistreatment, lacking oversight, and environmental damage. These funds boosting Oregon's economy could:

- Support local, direct to consumer innovative crops
- Increase regional food system resilience and rural economic development
- Support homegrown garden initiatives with free classes and education
- Invest in low carbon footprint alternatives to wasteful meat production

- Provide a state-funded program on the future of lab-grown meat, which requires 600 times <u>LESS</u> water, food, clear-cut grazing land, and transport.
