Attention: House Committee on Rules Subject: HB 3110 Testimony – Publicly Traded Corporations minimum number of women and people from underrepresented communities on their Boards of Directors

Dear Committee Members:

I am writing in support of this bill.

2020 marked the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Vote for Women in the United States. Women (and men) celebrated this achievement, but because of Covid, it was not the grand celebration that we all had hoped for. One hundred years of women voting, and it took many years to gain that suffrage.
