I am a health care provider in Springfield, OR and I promote the use of food in its best, most unadulterated form, usually raw.

- 1. Commercially available raw butter has an excellent track record for food safety:
 - a. CDC's foodborne illness database data: zero outbreaks of illness 1998 to 2016 and none reported since
- b. 11 other states allow for the sale and or distribution of raw butter, including California where one dairy Raw Farm formerly Organic Pastures Dairy Company has sold over 2 million pounds of raw butter over the past 20 years without incident.
- 2. Passage of HB 2612 would better enable dairy farmers to make a living and could help stop or reduce the decline in the number of Oregon dairy farms.
 - a. 1992 Oregon had 1,900 farms with dairy cows (USDA data).
 - b) Today Oregon has 194 dairy farms (Oregon Dairy Farmers Association)
- 3. Consumer demand for locally produced foods like raw butter continues to grow; I promote this to my patients.
- a) OR Dairy industry dollars going out of state Oregon residents travel elsewhere, for example to California, to purchase raw butter. Passage of HB 2612 would keep more of the food dollar within the state.
