My name is Deian Salazar. I am a youth activist living with disabilities in East Portland, dedicated to helping the underserved and left behind. Our approach of treating drug addiction as a criminal issue instead of a health issue has done more to hurt than to help people suffering from drug dependency.

The cost of criminalizing drug addiction has disproportionately fallen on the poor and communities of color, so addressing addiction is a social justice issue as well as a health issue. Communities in East Portland and beyond need the support SB 755 provides to relieve families chafing under the burden of incarceration, uplift people from poverty and homelessness, and experience the world without the shackles of drug addiction.
