There are critical issues that effect the actual residents of this community - water resources, a processing plant that uses BUTANE, to extract OIL from a plant - a massive fire risk.

Please take our concerns seriously, when there is an explosion, as this is merely an investment and not a scrappy start-up wanting to be a thoughtful member of the community, people will get hurt, die and lose their homes ... look at what happened this afternoon in Cornelius, thoughts and prayers will be too late and not matter.
