Chair Wagner, Vice-Chair Girod, members of the committee, for the record my name is Jacob Menefee, I am a resident of Portland, Oregon and a recent PSU graduate. I am writing today to express my support for the passage of SB 262.

Over the years, I have worked at many different jobs across a number of industries. I've worked as a farm hand, a food service worker, a retail employee, an organizer. In every role I've ever been in, the expectation has always been the same; that I show up and that I do the work that I was being paid to do. I see no reason why that shouldn't also be the case for our elected leaders.
