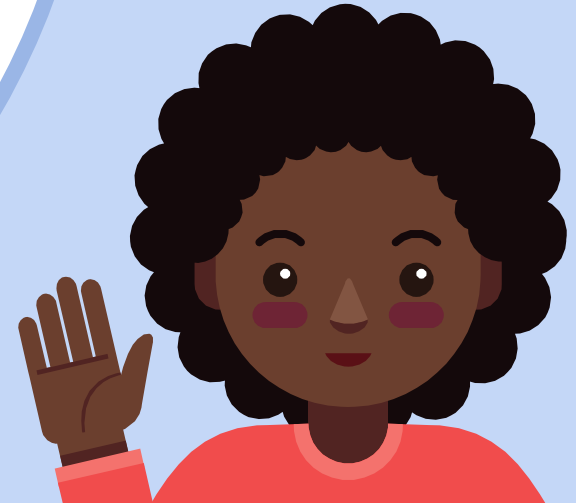

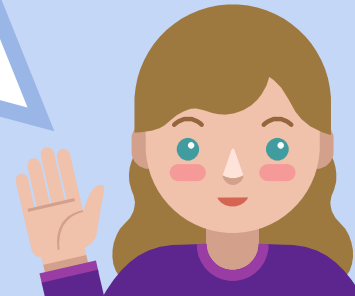

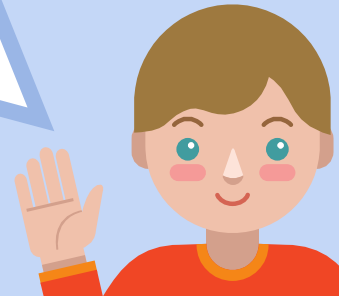

School Telehealth

School-Based Health Centers (SBHCs) and Mental Health

- Adolescents 10-21x more likely to get mental health services at an SBHC.
- Youth at SBHCs with mental health capacity were:
 - 12% less likely to report a depressive episode
 - 16% less likely to report suicidal ideation
 - 18% less likely to report a suicide attempt



SBHCs are Cost Effective

- Reduce inappropriate emergency room use
- Help CCO's meet their metrics on adolescent well visits, immunizations, and more.
- Leverage >\$3 for every \$1 the state invests.
